ISSUES

WZLD-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

Childhood Obesity - Children that are not active tend to be overweight and in cooperation with the Ad Council, we aired a series of announcements urging parents and children to spend time together in outdoor activities. American families everywhere are encouraged to be healthy and get active. The PSAs direct audiences to "search We Can! online" to find doable tips and activities for parents and kids.

Show Your Stripes Campaign - More than a million veterans are returning home over the next few years and we are leading the effort to help these men and women find jobs using their elite military training and professional skills. We aired a series of 15, 30 and 60 second announcements urging local businesses to "Hire a Vet".

Education - We aired a series of 30 second announcements informing our young listeners about the importance of an education. We focused on high school and college entrance. Special guests included local Education Foundation Director and a former local college athlete who has become successful in business.

Drunk Driving Prevention - We aired a series of 30 second announcements drawing attention to "Buzzed Driving". Some listeners do not consider a "buzz" as drunken driving. The overall campaign hopes to educate people that consuming even a few drinks can impair driving and that Buzzed Driving is Drunk Driving

Remembering 9/11 - We aired a series of 30 second announcements remembering the events of 9/11/2001 to honor those who lost their lives in the terrorist attack.

Texting and Driving Prevention - This campaign targeted young adult drivers with a focus on texting and driving prevention. Young adults live in a connected world where multitasking is the norm. This manifests in the car where they recognize texting and driving is dangerous, but do it anyway. We aired a series of 30 second announcements that explained that the average text takes a driver's eyes off the road for nearly five seconds. When traveling at 55mph, that's enough time to cover the length of a football field. The message being conveyed is that texting while driving isn't multitasking, it's essentially driving blind.
