#### WZLD-FM QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST

#### **ISSUES**

WZLD-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

Relief Effort For Victims of Hurricane Sandy - The Staten Island, New York area was hardest hit by Hurricane Sandy. Our area felt the same tragedy in 2005 with Hurricane Katrina. We teamed with local Ford Dealerships to collect supplies and food for the Sandy victims November 2 through November 8. We aired a series of 30 second announcements urging listeners to take a moment to "repay" our friends in the Northeast that came to our aid during Katrina. Our goal was one 18 wheeler of supplies, but we were able to send four! It was a true testament to the power of our citizen's compassion to victims of hurricane.

<u>Adoption -</u> November / National Adoption Month - We aired a series of 15 second announcements urging listeners to explore information regarding adoption of children in South Mississippi. We also aired a special 15 minute segment on Hotline our Public Affairs Program.

Annual Stuff a Bus Toy Drive - We aired a series of 30 second spots and appeared at seven locations December 5 -10, 2012 asking listeners to donate new unwrapped toys for local children in need. We coordinated our efforts with the Salvation Army, Petal Children's Task Force and Local Human Services. Over 1000 toys were donated to local children.

<u>Pink Ribbon Campaign</u> - We aired a series of 30 second announcements and were co- sponsor of the local Pink Ribbon Fund Gala that helped raise money benefiting local breast cancer patients. All money donated to local patients by Pink Ribbon Committee.

<u>Christmas Day Tornadoes</u> - Tragedy struck a dozen families on Christmas Day when severe weather including tornadoes ripped through Pearl River County in South Mississippi. We aired a series of 30 second announcements asking listeners to donate non perishable items, clothing and toiletries to the affected families. Our community effort created a tremendous response as we were able to collect items for many of the families that were affected. Items continued to pour in past New Years Day.
