<u>Description</u>: Food insecurity is a growing problem within many communities. Marie Costa-Roque, the Director of the Food Resources Program with the South Shore Community Action Council came on the show to outline a list of upcoming 2024 community food drives after the holidays and explain how donations benefit those within the community. The Food Resources program provides meals to local YMCA's, schools, Boys and Girls Clubs and church outreach programs.

Assistance for those with Autism

DATE: 1/14//24 Time: 6:30 a.m.

<u>Description</u>: The Arc of the South Shore has been in existence since 1951 and to date, has assisted over 100,000 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Their mission is to empower families and individuals of all ages to reach their fullest potential and live their best lives with high quality outcomes. Abby Parilla, the Chief Executive Officer of the Arc was our featured guest and spoke about the history of The Arc of the South Shore, how they assist people in our community and upcoming fundraiser and ways that listeners can support the ongoing programs initiated by the Arc.

American Hearth Month and National Wear Red Day

DATE: 1/21/24 Time: 6:30 a.m.

<u>Description</u>: To highlight February as American Heart Month and National Wear Red Day, National Wear Red Day, Dr. Megan Wasfy, a cardiologist at Massachusetts General Hospital spoke to shed light on a concerning statistic: nearly 45% of women aged 20 and older are living with some form of cardiovascular disease. This revelation underscores the urgent need to increase awareness of heart disease among women and take proactive steps towards prevention and treatment. She also spoke about the importance of people to join the "National of Lifesavers" and learn CPR.

She also spoke about the important programs funded by annual cookie sales.

Available Assistance for older adults with disabilities

<u>Description</u>: OCES, Old Colony Elder Services is an organization that supports the independence and dignity of older adults and individuals with disabilities by providing essential information and services that promote healthy, safe and independent living to empower individuals and communities to thrive. OCES Chief Executive Officer, Nicole Levy was our guest and she talked about their 50th Anniversary celebration taking place in 2024 in addition to highlighting the many services they provide within the community including Adult Family Care, Behavioral Health, Caregiver Support, Community Housing Options, Adult Protective Services, Health Insurance and Budget Guidance. She also outlined who was eligible to participate in the services offered by OCES and how interested people could get themselves or a family member involved.

Cape and Island United Way

<u>Description</u>: The Cape and Islands United Way is an agent of change for our local community. They unite people and organizations to identify the greatest challenges of our communities and develop collaborative solutions to bring lasting change.
