KHGG-AM 2-12 4Q Issues Report

The Arkansas Century Farm program is a new program that recognizes Arkansas' rich agricultural heritage and honors families who have owned and farmed the same land for at least 100 years. Two farms in the KHGG-AM listening area were awarded a sign and certificate by the Arkansas Agriculture Department: Grand Prairie Cattle Company of Charleston in Franklin county, and Morgan Farms of Clarksville in Johnson county. KHGG-AM covered the announcement November 29th made at the Franklin County Courthouse during our morning news/sports show.

History is alive in Fort Smith. Many unique events occurred along historic Garrison Avenue and nearby neighborhoods from 1817 until today. A local history professor at the University of Arkansas Fort Smith, Kevin Jones was interviewed by Karen Pharis about his book: Postcard History of Fort Smith. Jones discussed his research and acquisition of the postcards, and how they represent not only interesting sites, events and buildings from the past, but the certain meanings of the travel cards. Jones talked about his December 17 lecture at the UAFS campus, and his plans to research another book featuring postcards from Missouri.

The Spiro Mounds Archaeological Center is the only prehistoric Native American site open to the public in Oklahoma and is administered by the Oklahoma Historical Society. The Center is regularly open Wednesdays through Sundays. The center invited the public to attend their Winter Solstice observance at the Center. Historic Property manager Dennis Peterson visited with Karen Pharis regarding the Mayan calendar December 5th. Peterson invited listeners to attend his guided tour of the Spiro Mounds and enjoy free refreshments,, as well as hear about the history of the excavations at the historic site, Native American ceremonies and stories, and tales of unusual happenings associated

with the mounds. Peterson says he will also try to explain the complex Mayan calendar and why the Aztec were afraid of the end of the 52 year cycle.

KHGG-FM is a supporter of the Fort Smith police canine department, so it was pleased to have Sgt. Brian Rice to talk on KHGG-FM October 24th about the new training site donated to the department by Mars Petcare in Fort Smith. Enclosed and located on a half square acre behind the Mars Petcare plane in Barling, the new facility will allow the K-9s to practice their tracking skills and the officers to freely train their dogs. The facility will be accessible to the Fort Smith K-9 Unite and other local K-9 groups 24 hours a day, and its location in Barling will make it more accessible to K-9 officers. The new facility will advance the skills of the dogs and their handlers by featuring new obstacles that the k-9s have never trained on before, and will be certified by the United States Police Canine Association and the Arkansas State Police, helping the K-9s better prepare for the annual K-9 certification test.

UAFS men's basketball coach Josh Newman conducted his holiday basketball camp December 27th and 28th at the Stubblefield Center. KHGG-FM ran a series of public service announcements December 17th through the 26th promoting the camps. The camp was for boys and girls ages 5-15 and kids attending received a t-shirt and camp certificate. Participants had the opportunity to be coached by D-2 coaches as well as current UAFS Lions basketball players. KHGG-FM also broadcasts UAFS Lion and Lady Lion Basketball as they compete in the Heartland Conference.

KHGG-FM broadcasts High School football and Arkansas Razorback Football in addition to high school football on KQBK-FM, KFPW-FM and KFPW-AM and KHGG-AM. On December 4th, KHGG-FM sponsored the annual Dream Team Football Awards Banquet, honoring offensive and defensive players from 35 Arkansas and Oklahoma high schools. Recruiting expert Otis Kirk gave the

keynote speech, and each player received an award certificate. Selected players received plaques. KHGG-FM ran announcements featuring the names of the students being recognized November 26th through December 4th.
