## KHGG-AM Issues Report 4th Quarter 2020

KHGG-AM is a local sports talk radio station in Fort Smith, Arkansas. Every weekday morning from 7am until 8am we produce "Arklahoma Today": an hour-long live program featuring local newscasts with interviews with newsmakers, and feature interviews with public service officials. Current weather and traffic broadcasts are reported during the broadcast as well as the latest statewide news from the Arkansas Radio Network. The morning stock market report is provided along with sports discussions of local and state teams. The following is a summary of the guests and topics discussed. .
