KHGG-AM Third Quarter 2020 Issues Report

KHGG-AM simulcasts the hour-long weekday news and information program called "Arklahoma Today" 7am-8am. It features local news interviews, weather, traffic, sports information and public service announcements. It originates on KFPW-AM, The following are topics of discussion from third quarter, 2020.
