Lee County Probate Judge Bill English discussed upcoming updates to several Lee County roads. He also talks about a new detour happening to Lee County Road 65. Then, he provides listeners with information about next month's special election regarding the renewal of the school budget.

February 10 2019 – 6:00

United States Congressman Mike Rogers discussed the border wall and national security. He also talks about the passing of the Farm Bill and informs listeners about the Space Force that was announced. He also takes time to thank his constituents for re-electing him for another term.

February 17 2019 – 6:00

Lee County Probate Judge Bill English discussed the recent approval of a new roundabout and the lowering of speed limits around the roundabout on College St. He also discussed the various bridge projects going on in the county. He then gives information about the impending special election.

February 24 2019 – 6:00

City Manager Jim Buston discussed the happenings of the City Council meeting held on Feb 19, 2019. This included Jim giving information about the various programs and projects that are coming out of the city's partnership with the new Gogue Performing Arts Center.
