Issue: Community Awareness

Focus: The Cavanaugh Flight Museum is a non-profit 501(c)(3) educational organization. Their purpose is to promote aviation studies and keep America's aviation heritage alive. The annual Warbirds Over Addison event is their primary fundraiser, as well as an economic driver for the city of Addison. We spoke with the museum director, and with former pilots, supported by video of the flying World War Two aircraft that make up the show. Also did a segment with meteorologist Jeff Jamison to promote the upcoming weather day at the Ballpark in Arlington for KTVT. This is the 8th year of this popular student event. Issue: SENIOR CITIZENS ISSUES

Focus: Issues surrounding today's senior living. Retirement centers are trying to erase the stigma of the past 50 years. While more seniors are retiring healthy, many still require a number of daily medications. We looked at how and why a family should approach a senior member on moving into assisted living, how medical assessments are made, and how staff deal with patients who have onset dementia. Issue: CHILDRENS ISSUES

Focus: Issues surrounding keeping kids safe online. Over 33% of teens have sent/received a nude text. Over 1 million teens were bullied on Facebook in 2010, the last year for which there are reliable stats. We ran three CBS 11 news stories regarding online activities by teens, as well as giving parents tips and hints on what to look for and how to keep their children safe from predators online, as well as from other teens.
