Airdate 4/3/21 Topic: Immigration Host: Ken Molestina

Issue: More than 18,000 migrant children, many of them unaccompanied are in U-S custody. In the last week, reporters got their first look inside a crowded facility in Donna, a town near McAllen in South Texas. The Biden administration has set up a facility at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center in Downtown Dallas to temporarily house thousands of teens. Other shelters are quickly being established in places like Fort Bliss.

Topic: Weather Awareness

Issue: Here in North Texas we are in the spring severe weather season. What does that mean, especially if you are new to the area? This time of the year, we are more likely to see severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, hail and flash flooding. Topic: Texas Senate Bill 7- Election integrity bill

Issue: Political drama in the last hours of the Texas Legislature's regular session. Democrats walked out of the chamber, preventing a quorum, and keeping Republicans from passing Senate Bill 7, and the fallout is being felt days after lawmakers adjourned on Memorial Day.

Airdate 6/12/21 Topic: Juneteenth Host: Robbie Owens

Issue: It was on June 19th, 1865 that union troops in Galveston delivered the general order that slaves were freed, although the Emancipation Proclamation was issued two years earlier. There has been a push in recent years to recognize Juneteenth as a federal holiday. That call has been loudest in Fort Worth, from one woman, Ms. Opal Lee. As we will explain in this half hour, she has let her feet do the talking. Robbie Owens sat down with her recently, and introduces her to us in her own words.

Topic: Power demand during summer months

Issue: ERCOT issued an alert asking people to limit the use of electricity. Energy experts tell our Erin Jones that after the freeze and blackouts from the winter storms in February, they think ERCOT is being extra cautious. Brooke Rogers interviewed Joshua Rhodes with the Webber Energy Group at UT Austin. Kennedi Walker also covers the demand for generators to keep power on just in case.

Topic: Migrant issue along the border

Issue: It's drawing a stark contrast between the Biden administration's current handling of immigration and border policies, and the Trump administration's former policies. Governor Greg Abbott used two events that occurred during June to highlight what the state is doing to address the issue f immigrants

illegally crossing into the United States. The Governor's office told us that in a little over a week, just over half a million dollars has been raised through donations for the border wall. Last Friday, Kamala Harris made her first visit to the Texas Mexico border in her capacity as Vice President. She visited a migrant processing center in El Paso. The Vice President and the Biden administration has been criticized for its handling of the border situation.

Issue: Last Monday, Governor Greg Abbott announced that Texas would opt out of Federal pandemic-related unemployment benefits. For people out of work, that means starting on June 26th, they won't get the \$300 weekly supplement. In a statement, the Governor says the focus must be on helping unemployed Texans connect with the more than a million job openings, rather than paying unemployment benefits to remain off the employment rolls. Brooke Rogers interviewed the President of the Texas AFLCIO, who was disappointed with the Governor's decision. Ken Molestina spoke with Glenn Hamer with the Texas Association of Business., who supported the Governor's decision.
