To The Point	4/2/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: April in-depth reporting Host: Karen Borta Issues: As the war in Ukraine continues, some refugees are finding their way to North Texas where they are finding help in establishing a new home. Also, a North Texas congressman traveled to Poland to get a first-hand look at the growing refugee crisis. A recent UT Arlington graduate is in Ukraine, by choice, to document the war for the world to see.</p> <p>The FDA approved a second COVID booster shot for those over the age of 50. We take a look at the effort to get the American population boosted in case there's another wave of the virus.</p>

To The Point	4/9/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Big City Crime  Host: Ken Molestina  Issue: One person died and 16 others were shot at an outdoor concert in Dallas. We talked to the family of the concertgoer who died. Dallas Mayor Eric Johnson addressed safety issues that came to light after the shooting. And the Dallas 365 Safe, a public safety plan that's been around for two years, was examined for its effectiveness.</p> <p>Fort Worth is dealing with its own issues regarding violent crime. Fort Worth's police chief and city leadership unveiled a crime reduction plan with the hope of reducing violent crime by 10% in one year.</p>
To The Point	4/16/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Border security  Host: Karen Borta  Issue: Governor Greg Abbott unveiled the latest efforts to crackdown on border security in order to crack down on human smuggling. The effort included truck inspections which caused backlogs at the border between Texas and Mexico. Another part of the governor's plan involved sending undocumented migrants to Washington, D.C. where groups including Catholic Charities help the people get to where they want to go in the U.S.</p>
To The Point	4/23/2022	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Allergy season  Host: Brooke Katz  Issue: The spring allergy season is underway across North Texas. We look at what causes all of the sneezing and watery eyes and the solution that impacts the health of all North Texans. A doctor explains why some people have a bad allergic reaction to pollen and others don't.</p>

To The Point	4/30/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Trevor Reed</p> <p>Host: Madison Sawyer</p> <p>Issue: Trevor Reed, the North Texan who had been in a Russian prison for nearly three years, returned home. He was part of a prisoner swap. We look at all of the efforts to free Reed and heard from his parents, Joey and Paula Reed. Jack Fink talked to the Granbury community about what they've done to share Reed's story. Jason Allen reported on the Reed's appeal to all levels of government and the support they found from both sides of the aisle.</p>
To The Point	5/7/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Abortion</p> <p>Host: Karen Borta</p> <p>Issue: The abortion debate is front and center after a leaked Supreme Court draft opinion appears to show the court is leaning towards overturning Roe v. Wade. We gathered reactions from both sides of the abortion debate. Also, what happens in Texas if Roe is overturned which includes the Trigger Law passed by the Texas Legislature during the last session. A SMU Constitutional Law professor discussed the breach of trust that happened inside the Supreme Court because of the internal leak.</p>
To The Point	5/14/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Pressure on your money</p> <p>Host: Doug Dunbar</p> <p>Issue: Prices are going up for almost everything. We look at property values and the housing market. Property appraisals were released and the deadline to appeal is approaching. We examined the options of how to protest and make your best case to keep property values where they're at. There's also a new surge in gas prices. JD Miles examined why record highs in gas prices were happening now. We also talked to an expert who speculated when gas prices may fall.</p>

To The Point	5/21/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Texas power grid  Host: Brooke Katz  Issue: There is concern about the Texas power grid after a statewide call to conserve power as the state experienced near-record heat. ERCOT and the Public Utility Commission explained what happened. Governor Greg Abbott and his opponent in the November general election, Beto O'Rourke, weighed in with their opinions. We look at the future of the power grid as Texas heads into the summer months.</p>
To The Point	5/28/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Memorial Day  Host: Nicole Baker  Issue: Our nation honors the men and women who died serving our country in the military. We get the perspective of three groups about this holiday. We talked to leaders with Carry the Load, the National Medal of Honor Museum and Wreaths Across America.</p>
To The Point	6/4/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Uvalde School Shooting  Host: Keith Russell  Issue: Texas and the nation continue to struggle with the school shooting in Uvalde that left 19 children and 2 teachers dead. We examined school security issues that have come up since the shooting and efforts to address gun violence in the U.S.</p>
To The Point	6/11/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Uvalde Investigation  Host: Karen Borta  Issue: As funerals for the victims continue, the investigation into the law enforcement response comes into focus. Hearings continue in Austin and in Washington, D.C. Teachers are raising concerns about safety in the classroom as the focus shifts to the new school year in the fall.</p>
To The Point	6/18/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	<p>Topic: Juneteenth  Host: Robbie Owens  Issue: We have a conversation with Fort Worth's Opal Lee. She is considered the grandmother of Juneteenth and her efforts to have the day recognized as a national holiday.</p>

To The Point	6/25/22	6:30p CT	30 minutes	Topic: Uvalde Investigation Update Host: Brooke Katz Issue: A Texas Senate investigation into the Uvalde school shooting included stunning revelations from the head of Texas DPS about the law enforcement response to Robb Elementary school. We also heard from Texas Senator John Cornyn and the bipartisan effort to pass the first significant gun legislation in decades.
