Airdate: 1/15/22

Topic: School Superintendents

Host: Karen Borta

Issue: A leadership vacuum is developing in North Texas schools. In the span of 24 hours, the superintendents of Dallas and Fort Worth ISD announced their plans to step down. Nearly a dozen school districts in North Texas are in the process of finding new superintendents. The program also looked at the surging Covid case load among children.

Issue: A man took hostages at Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville. In this program, we heard from the Rabbi of the congregation and one of the members about what happened when they were taken hostage. The program took a close look at safety and security efforts in the wake of the situation as well as the community response and outpouring of support.

Topic: January in-depth reporting

Issue: The Rabbi held hostage continued told his story to a Congressional committee. The committee is considering whether to boost funding for a federal program to help protect houses of worship.

One year ago, a deadly pile-up of more than 130 vehicles on I-35W in Fort Worth claimed 6 lives. We sat down with the family of Aaron Watson who lost his life in the crash. We also heard from members of the Fort Worth Fire Department about that call, the response and their experience.

A recent ice storm may have been good for North Texas and the latest surge of Covid cases. New numbers released by Parkland's Center for Clinical Innovation showed a dramatic decline in Dallas County cases from two weeks ago.
