The Licensee broadcasts a regularly scheduled local public affairs show, "To the Point", at various times on the weekend through September 2. On September 11, the station started airing a one hour newscast at 7 P.M., Monday through Friday. The station also runs a number of public service announcements throughout each quarter of the year.

The program focused on reaction to the Court's decision and how it might impact programs at local universities and other educational institutions.</p>

Stories included a Grapevine church providing an option to the statewide problem of affordable childcare. A unique summer camp introduces students to technology and building their own robots in Coppell. And Fort Worth is bringing back a piece of history that was lost over a century ago.</p>

Also, a holistic form of therapy called Red-Light Therapy is being touted to help people battle depression.</p>

Also, why are sea levels rising and how is that potentially impacting the more than 3 thousand miles of Texas coastline.</p>

The stories included fentanyl poisonings and one family's mission to raise awareness about the drug. A Habitat for Humanity non-profit celebrated a special milestone in McKinney. And one North Texas city's fire department is re-thinking traditional roles as it looks to improve responses to emergency calls.</p>

The issue wasn't addressed by the Texas Legislature during the regular session or a special session. Also, the extreme heat this summer is causing athletic and band programs to make changes to practices in order to keep students and staff safe.</p>

And a teenager in Plano hasn't graduated high school, but she's hiked over one thousand miles around the world and the inspirational reason for making the effort.</p>

We highlighted a program run by the Texas Comptroller's Office where parents can enroll newborns in the state's pre-paid college tuition program.</p>

We looked at the charges facing Paxton, the key players in the trial and how the state got to this point of a rare impeachment trial in Texas. After our coverage, we highlighted a unique effort in the DFW area called North Texas Giving Day. The fundraising effort helps thousands of non-profits in North Texas.</p>
