According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, twenty veterans commit suicide nationwide each day. That is four times the rate of active-duty service members and a higher rate than the rest of the US population. Discussed the reasons behind the high suicide rate, how family and friends can intervene, treatment options available for service members and the importance of a support system for families.
