WOAY TV airs the following programs that fulfill FCC requirements. The enclosed list provides information about programming for the months of October, November and December.

FORUM-A locally produced talk show. This Public Affairs program addresses various topics of community concern, both current and local issues and events. It is broadcast Sunday Mornings at 10 a.m. and repeated as needed.

In addition we air three (3) hours of live, local news casts per day Monday-Friday, and one (1) hour each on Saturday and Sunday.

JULY

July 7th- Guest: Melanie Seiler of Active Southern West Virginia. She coordinates with a volunteer in each community to get people active throughout Southern West Virginia (Raleigh-Fayette-Summers & Nicholas Counties). We have too many health problems in WV due to inactivity. Ms. Seiler has been talking to school's Board of Education about joining in.

July 14th- Guest: Mary Ellen Griffith of the Appalachian Folklife Center at Pipestem State Park. They primarily sponsor Church groups of teenagers who do service work in the community followed by educational & recreational activities. They gather in groups with adult supervision and stay in campers. Ms. Griffith wanted to promote their 50th Anniversary Festival on the weekend of July 17-18-19.

July 21st- Guest: Mayor Bob Johnson of Richwood, WV. He talked about the Cherry River Festival which takes place in the last week of July. This year's festival will feature a homecoming for the High School Alumni. At its Peak-Richwood was a school district within itself. The festival features the so called Cherry River Navy and ends up on Saturday with the big parade.

July 28th- Guest: Scott Hill of Theater WV. He talked about their current show "Pippi Longstockings". Also, he promoted "Phil Dirt and The Dozers" concert in August. He also talked about the "Haunted Coal Mines" which they sponsor. On September 1st they will be starting their membership drive.

August 2nd- Guest: Congressman Evan Jenkins. He talked about trying to get the WV Coal Miners jobs back that we are losing. He will work with the state takeover to help with the physical aspect of the schools after the failure of the \$39 million bond levy. He wants to think in terms of a 25 year plan.

August 23rd- Guest: Kristi Atha Rader, Vice Chair for the Oak Hill "Oak Leaf Festival".
