April 3rd, 11:30AM – Guest- Andy Austin of the New River Transit Authority. This is a local bus system for Raleigh & Fayette County. He talked about their current routes and schedules. He also talked about how they were funded by Federal Grants and County Commission contributions. He also talked about future routes when West Virginia University students start coming to Beckley.

April 10th, 11:30AM- Guest- Twanna Warner, Sexual Advocate for Fayette County and Sarah Warf, Sexual Advocate for Raleigh County, Summers and Nicholas County. They are with "The Women's Resource Center" for battered women. This month is "Sexual Assault Awareness". May 15th, 11:30 AM -Guest- Leslie Baker of the Youth Museum of Southern West Virginia. She talked about the summer events at the Museum. Ms. Baker also talked about how they just finished restoring "Dinky the Train" thru local contributions. She is also in charge of Parks and Recreations for the City of Beckley where she talked about the prepping for the City of Beckley pool opening.
