The following are shows and programs focusing on community concerns and needs of Central Illinois. Also listed are WAND-TV sponsored events designed to meet certain needs of communities throughout the area.

WAND-TV Community Outreach Involvement:

WAND-TV helped promote the **United Way Campaign**. In January and February we ran two PSA's thanking the community for their United Way support. The United Way Chairman and an Allocation Committee Member were the talent for the PSA's.

WAND-TV ran four PSA's honoring local African American's for **Black History Month**. Anchors Dawn Sterling, Sean Streaty, Mikaela Hunt and Marcus Thorpe were the talent for the PSA's. The local African Americans were chosen because of their contributions to the community.

Millikin University and the American Cancer Society held a Three Point Shoot Out to raise money for the Local ACS. WAND-TV ran a PSA to promote the event. Anchor Marcus Thorpe was a guest announcer at the Event. WAND-TV also had a team that shot at the event. They raised about \$25,000 at the event.

The **Law Enforcement Polar Plunge** was the first Saturday in March. WAND-TV's Anchor Jill Monier appeared on the PSA to promote the plunge. We also used local radio personalities as talent for the b-roll. WAND had two people who took the plunge. They were hoping to raise \$30,000 for the event; they ended up raising \$34,000.

News Director Jon McCall represented WAND at the **Illinois State University Communications Fair.** The Fair was in a new location and was not very well attended.

Business Manager Angie Rhodes and Public Affairs Director Ken Frye represented the station at the **University of Illinois Career Fair**. We spoke with dozens of applicants looking for jobs and internships. The resumes were given to the appropriate department heads.
