When nothing's worked...and everything been tried...they come here: to the counselors The Catherine Freer Wilderness Trek Program. Call it the final stop on the last-chance trail--these are teenagers whose parents have tried everything to connect with their children, who are suffering from addling emotional, scholastic, behavioral, and drug problems so severe their families are running out of time. Chris Cuomo ventures deep into the Nevada wilderness...on a search for the secret to saving a troubled teen. An extreme twenty-one day trek and a three-day "solo" excursion constitute a grueling encounter with nature and themselves. Chris Cuomo asks, does it work? Does wilderness therapy truly bring parents and children closer together--or merely push them further away? An encore presentation of a startling encounter, tonight we check in with the teens we followed and see where they are now. For some, the results are inspiring, others were not so lucky.

Two families, whom we tracked for two years: a husband in wife in Virginia, desperate but unable to have a child, and a couple in Atlanta, determined to help them, despite the fact they had *never* met. For Greg and Cara Vest, adoption was not a solution. For Bob and Suzanne Gray, fertility treatments were familiar ground -- they had already conceived four children with the help of cutting-edge medical procedures--which left 23 additional frozen embryos remaining. What the Grays decided to do for the Vests was surprising. Equally so the fact their donated baby would have no genetic material in common with its new parents...and look more like the Grays children. In this age of moral crisis and modern medicine, John Quinones asks "what does it really mean to be a parent?"
