# PUBLIC/COMMUNITY AFFAIRS July, August, September 2007

The following are programs focusing on community concerns and needs of Central Illinois. Also listed are WAND-TV sponsored events designed to meet certain needs of communities throughout the area and PSA's ran during this quarter.

## WAND-TV Community Outreach Involvement: July, August, September 2007

The **WAND-TV Fan Club** kicked off in June and ended in July. We collected 827 fans this year, nearly double last year's total. The fans were donated to the local senior centers and they distributed them to the seniors in their county.

Lakeside Arts Festival – Rodney T. Miller Triathlon took place the Independence Day weekend. This was the first year for the triathlon. Over 400 athletes participated.

WAND-TV helped promote the **Stuff the Bus** Campaign. Pepsi and Wal-Marts stores across the market promoted the event. The supplies collected were given away to school kids in need by local county school resources agencies.

Several people at WAND-TV volunteered at the **American Cancer Society** – **Relay for Life** event at Richland Community College. The event was promoted on the community calendar.

The **Decatur Celebration** was the first weekend in August. WAND-TV did live remotes and had several people and news personnel volunteer at the booth. WAND-TV gave a way a trip to St. Louis and souvenir cups.

The first Tuesday in August is **National Night Out**. City Law Enforcement agencies across the country came out to meet and greet residents in the inner city. It was also a chance for neighbors to light their porch lights and band together against crime.

WAND-TV went to the **Illinois State Fair** – **for Fair Weather Day**. It was part of Decatur Days at the State Fair. We gave away souvenir cups at the event and did weather demonstrations.

WAND-TV sponsors the **Blues in the Park** performances during the summer. Different artists are featured once a month. WAND talent emceed one of the shows.

The Project Success – Rockin' Back to School Fundraiser was promoted by WAND.

Women's Day at the Decatur Civic Center featured 60 booths dealing with women issues. WAND talent spent some time at the show.

WAND-TV was the media sponsor for the **Urbana Sweetcorn Festival**. It was good to be involved with events in neighboring communities.

The Farm Progress Show comes to Decatur every other year. This was our year. WAND-TV did a half hour special previewing this year's show. News did live hits through out the show, all three days.

WAND-TV was a sponsor of the **Allerton Music Barn Festival**. This upscale event promoted dinner and music with the same theme.

Twenty-five WAND-TV employees volunteered during the **WAND-TV Day of Caring** at the Promise Community Center. We picked up trash, helped paint playground equipment, helped make a garden out of a trashy lot, and more.

WAND-TV sponsored the **Furry Scurry** event for the local animal shelter. People could run and walk with their pets and partake in various other events during the day.

The I Love to Read Campaign kicked off in September. Dozens of schools throughout Central Illinois are participating. Kids in first through sixth grades are reading a determined amount of minutes. If they reach that level, they have the chance to win prizes.

The **United Way Campaign** kicked off in Decatur and other communities in September.

**NBRA Boat Races** – **Balloonfest** took place at Lake Shelbyville. WAND was a sponsor of the event. Several Employees volunteered for the festival and as balloon crew.

The **Train Fair** was at the Decatur Civic Center. This is part of the WAND-TV sponsored events at the Civic Center.
