### Black History Month:

WAND-TV ran many PSA's honoring local and National African Americans during **Black History Month.** Included in the spots were: Ben Birkshire, the first African-American Man in Macon County; George Washington Carver, for agricultural related discoveries; Ellsworth Dansby, from Decatur and one of the original Tuskegee Airmen of WWII; Fredrick Douglass, abolitionist who spoke in Decatur; Mamie Till Mobley, equal rights activist who spoke in Decatur; Judge James Parsons of Decatur became the first African-American appointed to a Federal Judgeship; and Sec of State Colin Powell who also visited central Illinois in 1998. These spots ran the month of February.

# Law Enforcement Torch Run Polar Plunge:

WAND-TV sponsored the **Law Enforcement Torch Run Polar Plunge** to benefit Special Olympics in five local counties. This was our second Polar Plunge. The first raised nearly fifteen thousand dollars and the second raised \$19,352.42. The plunge was very successful.
