The following are shows and programs focusing on community concerns and needs of Central Illinois. Also listed are WAND-TV sponsored events designed to meet certain needs of communities throughout the area.

WAND-TV Community Outreach Involvement: July, August, September 2006

The **WAND-TV Fan Club** is under way. It will run June 13 through July 9. Local Senior Centers in seven counties have collected over 445 fans.
