#### WAND-TV Community Outreach Involvement:

**Operation Heat Relief Fan Drive**, July 2005, WAND helped collect 479 fans and \$1,000 for the purchase of fans for six counties.

**Downtown Decatur Hawaiian Luau benefiting Special Olympics**, August 19, WAND-TV helped promoted the Hawaiian Luau helping raise over \$7,000 for Special Olympics.

Opening Ceremonies of the Illinois Special Olympic Fall Games, September 10, News Anchor Mikaela Hunt and Ken Frye were the masters of ceremony for the Fall Games Opening Ceremonies in Downtown Decatur's Central Park. There were 700 in attendance.

**Herald and Review Career Fair**, September 14, WAND-TV participated in the Herald and Review Career Fair at the Decatur Civic Center. We received several dozen resumes for our one job opening in sales.

United Way Small Business Blitz, September 28, WAND-TV did live shots during the kick off of the United Way Small Business Blitz.
