PUBLIC/COMMUNITY AFFAIRS July, August, September 2004

The following are shows and programs focusing on community concerns and needs of Central Illinois. Also listed are WAND-TV sponsored events designed to meet certain needs of communities throughout the area.

Community Outreach Involvement:

Operation Heat Relief: Beginning June 9 and ending July 13 **Operation Heat Relief** collected fans to give to seniors and families in the low-income bracket. This was the fifth year collecting electric fans. We collected 478 fans this year and 3,501 the past five years.

Decatur Celebration: First Weekend in August
August brought **The Decatur Celebration** to Central Illinois. WAND-TV was involved station wide covering events, doing a live Saturday Morning broadcast of the Celebration Parade and manning the WAND booth. We also promoted the Celebration with Public Affairs Shows and PSA's.

WAND Food Drive: Due to local food pantries shelves running bare, WAND held a one week food drive in August. Ten Grocery Stores in Decatur helped with their participation. We collected approximately 25,000 items to give to the three large local food pantries.
