Urban Gardening with Ciscoe

Friday, July 2nd, 2021, 8:00 – 8:30P (Rerun)

Gardening expert Ciscoe Morris looks at the importance of green space in a big city like Seattle. He talks to a supervisor of the Seattle P-Patch Community Gardening Program. Next, Ciscoe goes to Brander Gardens Park to find out about container gardening and the importance of compost from a Seattle Tilth instructor. In segment two, Ciscoe is on the Seattle University campus to visit Michael Shiosaki from Seattle Parks and Recreation to hear how green spaces in the city improve the environment and provide a place for people to enjoy. Ciscoe also finds out from Aaron Clark of Stewardship Partners on how rain gardens help cut down on pollution. Finally, Ciscoe meets with Jeff Steenbergen from the Puget Sound Beekeepers Association at Pollination Garden to find out how beneficial and vital bees are to the environment. This KING 5 produced Ciscoe half-hour special program originally aired in 2016.

KING 5 reporter Glenn Farley hosts an environmental special on wildfires and the science of wildfires. He answers the question of why wildfires in our area are getting worse and what is being done to make wildfires less dangerous both to the survival of the forest and to ourselves. Glenn talks to the experts, looking at the role of climate change and how old forest management practices have contributed to the problem and how new forest management practices may lead us out. Scorched Earth examines wildfires from many angles, including ways everyone can protect themselves. This program aired in its entirety on 9/9/2021.
