rainbow colors adorning the meeting places; a judge orders "The Nigerian 69" —
men and women caught up in a raid in late August and charged with "allegedly
conducting and attending a same-sex wedding ceremony" — to all be released on

SEGMENT #1 – "NewsWrap": A new report confirms spikes in anti-queer attacks in Uganda following enactment of the East African nation's infamous "Kill the Gays" law, but most abuse is coming from individuals and not the government; popular cross-dressing Iraqi Instagram and TikTok star "Noor BM" is shot dead in Baghdad; Colorado's Trump-worshipping Congressperson LAUREN BOEBERT disgustingly disrespects a top transgender Defense Department official in yet another stupid political stunt on the House floor that goes nowhere; the second meaningless debate of Republican presidential wannabes without polls-leading candidate Donald Trump underscores the party's anti-queer policies, especially its war on transgender young people (with comments by VIVEK RAMASWAMY, MIKE PENCE, and an unrelated but applicable retort the following day by JOE BIDEN); a 3-judge panel of the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals decides to let laws banning pediatric gender-affirming healthcare in Kentucky and Tennessee take effect even as the constitutionality of each statute is being challenged in lower courts; a Texas federal judge strikes down the state's law banning family-friendly drag shows as a violation of constitutionally-protected free speech; and the southwestern Charlotte County, Florida school district orders the removal of all books in elementary and middle school libraries, media centers and classrooms with queer content or characters (written by GREG GORDON, edited by LUCIA CHAPPELLE, reported this week by ALLAN TIJAMO & ELENA BOTKIN-LEVY and produced by BRIAN DeSHAZOR) [10:45] + "TWO" E-newsletter/Donor Thanks Promo (with a JETHRO TULL music bed) [:27] . . . .

SEGMENT #1 – "NewsWrap": The Mauritius Supreme Court decriminalizes gay sex, but Eswatini's government defies its Supreme Court order to legally register a queer advocacy group; Lebanese Christian fanatics assault and injure at least 3 peaceful participants at a Beirut march for LGBTQ equality; more than a dozen supposedly queer-positive U.S. schools, from elementary to college, get bomb threats after being "exposed" by online "groomer" conspiracy peddler Libs of TikTok, which has some 2.5 million followers; Olivia Hill is sworn in as a Nashville lawmaker, making her the first transgender candidate elected to public office in

SEGMENT #2 - Twenty-five years ago this week, a young gay man's murder moved hearts around the world. "This Way Out" called his story "THE BOOK OF MATTHEW": It was not the first time a gay, lesbian, bi, or transperson had fallen victim to brutally-fatal homophobia, and it certainly was not the last. But when Matthew Shepard died on October 12, 1998, his murder became an international emblem of senseless homophobic hatred. As the world observes the 25th anniversary of the tragedy and its aftermath, we re-open our extended report from October 19, 1998, when "This Way Out " collected the immediate sounds of outrage and response that followed the tragedy. At dozens of marches, memorial services and candlelight vigils, gays and lesbians across the U.S. have been responding to the brutal gay-bashing death of Wyoming college student Matthew Shepard with shock, grief and anger. VERA AVERY BROWN [Pacifica Network News] details the crime and explores some of the issues it raises with Jim Osborne, President of the University of Wyoming Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Association -- who disputes claims by one of the suspect's father that his son's actions were provoked by Shepard's coming on to him; Wyoming Governor Jim Geringer and state legislator Michael Massey discuss the merits of legislation to enhance the penalties for hate crime convictions; Los Angeles Gay & Lesbian Center Executive Director Lorri Jean charges right-wing Christian groups behind the recent spate of "change" ads with fomenting violence, and laments the reluctance of public officials to support anti-bias education in the high schools, while Tony Varona, legal counsel for the queer advocacy group Human Rights Campaign describes the pervasiveness and impact of anti-queer violence; openly-gay Massachusetts Congressman Barney Frank, trailblazing comedian Ellen DeGeneres and Shepard's best friend Walter Bouden are among the speakers at a candlelight vigil on the steps of the Capitol Building in Washington, D.C. October 14th; participants at an October 12th vigil in West Hollywood, California describe anti-gay actions they've experienced, how the threat of violence has affected their public conduct, and blame homophobia-spouting lawmakers for indirectly endorsing anti-gay violence; JOHN QUINLAN reports from an October 13th march, rally and candlelight vigil in rainy Madison, Wisconsin, where the importance of community and visibility are reaffirmed in speech and song; religious extremists travel from Kansas and Texas on October 16th to Matthew's hometown of Casper, Wyoming to damn him as a

sodomite in a placard-waving demonstration across the street from his funeral as onlookers condemn them, and Matthew's father Dennis Shepard expresses the family's appreciation for the overwhelming support they've received from around the world; one of Matthew's cousins bids him a poignantly poetic farewell during the funeral; and we conclude with some thoughts — given the continued prevalence of anti-queer violence these days, with transgender women of color being the biggest targets — about the sudden mainstream media attention in 198 to this one albeit especially horrifying example (with music by MELISSA ETHERIDGE and BLACKBERRI) 14:59

accompanied the historic November 2nd consecration of the Reverend Gene Robinson as the first openly gay bishop of the Episcopal Church USA. The leadership of the worldwide Anglican Communion, of which the Episcopalians are a part, has warily anticipated the moment with bated breath. Robinson's election in June 2003 by the Diocese of New Hampshire and his confirmation in August at the denomination's General Convention, and a Canadian Anglican diocese's decision to allow blessings for same-gender couples earlier this year, have sent traditionalists into a tailspin. They warned that the gay priest's elevation to bishop in particular would put the unity of the Communion in serious jeopardy. But Robinson firmly resisted calls for him to step aside, and when the day arrived three to four thousand supporters, including some 50 bishops, gathered to witness his consecration at the University of New Hampshire's Whittemore Center in Durham. Inside, singing with her Exeter church's 100-voice choir, was Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays [P-FLAG] National Board Member PEGGY GAGE. A lifelong, active Episcopalian, Gage describes the groundbreaking event from her unique perspective and participant's view of the proceedings for *This Way Out's* GREG GORDON [with excerpts from the service's choral music and statements by two of the people who spoke in opposition to Robinson's consecration during the ceremony, REV. SEGMENT #2 - One little word — "married" — was starting to change the world for North America's queer couples back in 2003, but it was definitely not just "like that." In these two flashback reports, we covered major high court rulings on the way to marriage equality: one in the Canadian province of ONTARIO, and one 20 years ago this week in the U.S. state of MASSACHUSETTS: from the "This Way Out" program of 6/16/03: Same-gender couples in Canada have seemingly crossed the final frontier in the struggle for full legal recognition of their relationships. The province of Ontario's Court of Appeal ruled on June 10th that it was a violation of Canada's Charter of Rights and Freedoms to deny marriage equality to queer partners, but unlike similar rulings by courts in British Columbia and Quebec, the Ontario judges ordered the government to begin issuing

marriage licenses to gay & lesbian couples immediately. And as HEATHER KITCHING [Queer FM/CITR-Vancouver] reports, it's almost certainly the beginning of the end of Canada's ban on same-gender marriage. Commenting are MICHAEL LESHNER, one of the litigants who, with Michael Stark, became the first queer couple in North America to be legally married by a judge (with segment intro music from "Married" by RON RIFKIN, and feature intro/outro music from "Wouldn't It Be Nice" by THE BEACH BOYS); then, from "NewsWrap" on the "This Way Out" program of 11/24/03, anchored by CINDY FRIEDMAN and JON BEAUPRE: Introduced by a brief excerpt from the song "Defenders Of Marriage" by ROY ZIMMERMAN -- with a review of the historic Goodridge versus Department Of Public Health ruling announced on November 18th by the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court declaring that "barring an individual from the protections, benefits and obligations of civil marriage solely because that person would marry a person of the same sex violates the Massachusetts Constitution." Some of the events that made it historic are the focus of this week's special show (with intro music from "Rent" and occasional instrumental music under from "It Was A Very Good Year" performed by JOHN BASILE). One 2003 event in particular was arguably one of the most significant queer news stories of the 21st century (from NewsWrap on the "This Way Out" program of 6/30/03, anchored by CINDY FRIEDMAN and CHRISTOPHER GAAL): The U.S. Supreme Court strikes down "demeaning" state sodomy laws that criminalize queers: a comprehensive report on the 6-3 Lawrence versus Texas decision overturning the Texas statute and similar laws in 12 other states, emphatically reversing the Court's 1986 Bowers vs. Hardwick decision that had upheld Georgia's since repealed sodomy ban; quoting from Justice Anthony Kennedy's majority opinion, Justice Sandra Day O'Connor's concurring opinion, and dissenting opinions by Justices Clarence Thomas and Antonin Scalia; some of the implications of the ruling's especially bold language on such issues as marriage equality, and how some of the affected states are responding to the ruling ... then: the Supreme victory over U.S. sodomy laws has queer activists rejoicing at pre-planned rallies and impromptu street parties across the country, and leaves the Religious Right reeling, as reported by DAVID TAFFET in Dallas [with thanks to Geoff Staples at RadioLeft.com], BRYAN GOEBEL in San Francisco, and JD DOYLE in Houston, and with comments by -- "in order of appearance" -- Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund Legal Director and lead attorney in the Lawrence vs. Texas case Ruth Harlow; Dallas Gay & Lesbian Alliance President Roger Wedell; Peter Sprigg of the Family Research Council, Robert Knight of the Culture and Family Institute, National Clergy Council President Rev. Rob Schenck and Rev. Jerry Falwell; Kate Kendall of the National Center for Lesbian Rights, Jennifer Pizer of the San Francisco-area Lambda Legal office and openly-gay San Francisco Supervisor Tom Ammiano; litigants John Lawrence and Tyron Garner and their local attorney Mitchell Katine, and long time Houston activist Ray Hill; plus commentary by queer journalist and columnist REX WOCKNER in San Diego; and with music from "Battle Hymn of the Republic: performed by ELVIS PRESLEY, "God Bless America" performed by KATE SMITH, and with intro/outro music from "The Sodomy Song" written and performed by ROMANOVSKY &

PHILLIPS; and a "postscript" music bed from the instrumental intro to TRIUMPH's
