SEGMENT #1 – "NewsWrap": Uganda lawmakers celebrate passage of the 2023 version of their Anti-Homosexuality Act that reinstates the death penalty for "aggravated homosexuality" and even makes it illegal to come out; Namibia's Supreme Court disallows the Namibian citizenship of the son born via surrogate in South Africa to gay bi-national couple Namibian Philip Luhl and his Mexican spouse Guillermo Delgado [with brief comments by their attorney UNO KATJIPUKA]; thugs attack Pride-attempting LGBTQ activists in the Bosnian city of Banja Luka; the Supreme Courts of Bolivia and Nepal each order the full legal recognition of same-gender couples; the World Athletics Council bans trans-

female competitors from all elite track and field events, while Wyoming becomes the latest U.S. state to ban trans female students from the 8th to 12th grade from participating in school sports; Arkansas' Republican-controlled government enacts 2 anti-trans bills, one allowing anyone who received gender-affirming care as a minor to sue their doctors for malpractice, and the other requires trans students and staff to use campus bathrooms based on their birth certificate gender; Nebraska advances a bill to ban gender-affirming healthcare for trans young people [with comments by State Senator MEGAN HUNT]; Kentucky's Democratic governor vetoes bills to ban gender-affirming care for minors and requiring all trans people to use bathrooms based on their birth certificate gender, but a Republican-dominated legislature could override them, while Kansas' Democratic governor vetoes a young trans sports ban bill for the 3rd consecutive year that this time could be overridden by the majority Republican legislature; Utah's Republican government bans conversion therapy for minors; anti-queer rightwing thugs assault peaceful LGBTQ protestors in a Sydney suburb outside a speech by one of Australia's most outspoken trans-phobic MPs [with day-before violence planner CHRISTIAN SUKKAR in a social media post, and on-scene sound of the melee]; meanwhile, British anti-trans campaigner Posie Parker (AKA Kellie-Jay Keen-Minshull) gets supportive Nazi salutes outside Parliament House in Melbourne, while independent Aboriginal M.P. LILIA THORPE gets roughly arrested trying to storm the stage of a Parker speech in Canberra; while members of the far-right U.S. militia group The Proud Boys get out-protested by defenders of a Drag Queen Story Hour being held at Manhattan's LGBTQ Center and hosted by state Attorney General Letticia James [with brief comments by attending gay New York City Councilman ERIK BOTTCHE] (written by GREG GORDON, edited by LUCIA CHAPPELLE, reported this week by SARAH MONTAGUE & DAVID HUNT, and produced by BRIAN DeSHAZOR) [10:59] + "This Way Out Donor Thanks/E-Newsletter promo (with a music bed by CREDENCE CLEARWATER REVIVAL) [:26] 11:25

of Scotland, making him the first Muslim to lead a European democracy; U.S.
VICE PRESIDENT KAMALA HARRIS pushes GHANA PRESIDENT NANA

AKUFO-ADDO to quash a horrific anti-LGBTQ bill now being considered in Parliament [with comments by each at a March 27th joint press conference in the West African nation]; outraged Kiwis end the New Zealand speaking tour of British anti-trans campaigner Posie Parker before she's able to say one bigoted word [with sound from the estimated 5,000 protesters in Auckland]; Republican majorities in the U.S. states of Iowa, Georgia, West Virginia and Kentucky enact bills to ban most gender-affirming care for transgender people under the age of 18, while Republican majorities in Iowa, Idaho, Kentucky, and Florida approve bills to require the use by transgender people of sex-segregated public facilities, like bathrooms and locker rooms, based only on their birth certificate gender [with opposition testimony in Florida by trans-man KALEB HOBSON-GARCIA and a trans-teen's father, JEFF WALKER]; and a right-wing-pressured school superintendent in Wisconsin bans kids at Heyer Elementary School from singing their version of "RAINBOWLAND", the 2017 duet by MILEY CYRUS and DOLLY PARTON, because it "could be perceived as controversial" [with excerpts from the song and brief comments by SARAH SCHINDLER, the parent of a 7-year-old at the school] (written by GREG GORDON, edited by LUCIA CHAPPELLE, reported this week by JOHN DYER V & AVA DAVIS, and produced by BRIAN DeSHAZOR). "This Way Out: The International LGBTQ Radio Magazine" debuted on non-commercial community stations on April 1, 1988, and at last count it's broadcast on almost 200 local terrestrial and internet outlets in Canada, New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, the Philippines, and the USA, as well as on the World Radio Network in English for North America, Africa, Asia-Pacific, the Caribbean and Europe. Thirty-five years of recorded LGBTQ life is worth preserving. Later this month "This Way Out" CEO and "NewsWrap" Producer BRIAN DESHAZOR will be a presenter at the gender and sexuality caucus of the RADIO PRESERVATION TASK FORCE OF LIBRARY OF CONGRESS in WASHINGTON, DC. In observance of our 35th anniversary, Brian talks to Radio Preservation Task Force chair JOSH SHEPPERD about the show's historic legacy and the project to maintain it. But first, Coordinating Producer GREG GORDON tells "NewsWrap" anchor MICHAEL TAYLOR GRAY how "This Way Out" was born. SEGMENT #1 – "NewsWrap": The U.S. Supreme Court rejects West Virginia's emergency request to continue its ban on 12-year-old trans track and field athlete Becky Pepper-Jackson from competing as a member of her middle school's girls team while lower federal courts consider the ban's constitutionality; Kansas Republicans shove through a ban on any gender-affirming care for trans young people under the age of 18, and another bill to force trans people to use sex-segregated public facilities, like bathrooms, that match their birth gender; Republican governors in Indiana and Idaho each sign bills outlawing all gender-affirming healthcare for under-18 trans young people, and Idaho adds prison time for any healthcare professional who violates the ban; North Dakota Republican lawmakers set an ugly record by advancing to their Republican governor ten anti-queer bills in just one week that, among other rights restrictions, ban and criminalize gender-affirming care for trans youth under 18, ban kindergarten through college trans athletes from competing as themselves in girls' and women's school sports, ban all trans people from changing their legal gender, and ban them from using bathrooms based on their gender identity, along with outlawing family-friendly drag shows; New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy, a Democrat, swims against the tide by issuing an Executive Order to protect people providing and seeking gender-affirming healthcare in his state; the Biden administration's Education Department gets mixed reviews for its proposal to interpret Title IX, the landmark measure that bans bias in education based on gender, to outlaw blanket bans on trans student athletes, but gets heat for allowing certain anti-

trans exceptions; and country star and event co-host KELSEA BALLERINI performs her hit song "If You Go Down (I'm Going Down, Too)" at the CMT fan-based country music awards, with RuPaul's Drag Race veterans MANILA LUZON, KENNEDY DAVENPORT, JAN SPORT and OLIVIA LUX dancing and singing back-up vocals, to thumb their collective noses at the growing rash of state bans on family-friendly drag shows [includes a song excerpt and brief comments from 3 of the fierce artistes] (written by GREG GORDON, edited by LUCIA CHAPPELLE, reported this week by KALYN HARDMAN & MICHAEL LEBEAU and produced by BRIAN DeSHAZOR) [10:51] + "TWO" I.D. by Australian Broadcasting Corporation presenters NATE BYRNE and MON SHAFTER [:19] + "This Way Out Donor Thanks/E-Newsletter Promo (with a music bed by BILLY JOEL) [:30]. 11:40

SEGMENT #1 – “NewsWrap”: The United Kingdom’s National Health Service, claiming that their use has not been fully proven to be beneficial, drastically restricts access by transgender patients under the age of 18 to puberty blockers, while the U.K.’s Home Office announces an expansion of a program allowing gay men convicted of now-legal same-gender sex to apply for pardons to women convicted of lesbian sex, military service members, and men convicted of “solicitation of men”; Iceland bans conversion therapy, the debunked claim that LGBTQ people - notably including the "T" - can be made straight; the Australian state of Queensland drops reassignment surgery as a prerequisite to trans people as young as 12 changing the gender marker on their birth certificates and other government documents; the Australian Capital Territory becomes the first in the country to enact laws protecting intersex people from surgical intervention without their informed consent; Arizona’s Democratic Governor Katie Hobbs vetos an anti-trans “bathroom bill”, but Texas Republican Governor Greg Abbott signs a bill expanding his state’s ban on trans girls and women from competing in school sports under their gender identity to colleges and universities; Democratic Illinois Governor J.B.
