A native of Detroit, Herb Trix began his radio career as a country-western disc jockey in Roswell, New Mexico ("KRSY, your superkicker in the Pecos Valley"), in 1978. After a stint at an oldies station in Topeka, Kansas (imagine getting paid to play "Louie Louie" and "Great Balls of Fire"), he wormed his way into news, first in Topeka, and then in Freeport Illinois. While a graduate student in the Public Affairs Reporting Program at the University of Illinois at Springfield (then known as Sangamon State University), he got his first taste of public radio, covering Illinois state government for WUIS. Here in the Quad Cities, Herb worked for WHBF Radio before coming to WVIK in 1987. Herb also produces the weekly public affairs feature Midwest Week – covering the news behind the news by interviewing reporters about the stories they cover.

About WVIK: WVIK is the most listened-to public radio station in the Quad Cities area, broadcasting to over 40,000 listeners each month with thousands engaging online and on the WVIK App.

WVIK offers audiences in its 75-mile listening radius access to a wide variety of music, including classical and jazz selections, all curated by beloved local hosts. WVIK's award-winning newsroom is the only local radio news department in the Quad Cities. WVIK also produces a variety of podcasts that explore arts, culture and entertainment in the region. In addition to these services, WVIK maintains translators in Dubuque, Iowa, (95.9 FM) and Moline, Illinois (105.7 FM).

WVIK newsroom is a dominant presence in the Illinois and Iowa Quad Cities.

WVIK won several awards in the Iowa Broadcast News Association contest for entries broadcast in 2021.

- Marianna Bacallao was honored with a first in the Feature Category for Large Market Radio stations for her story "Cellist Plays for Vaccination Clinic." After participating in last year's WVIK Public Broadcasting Fellowship (funded by the Communityworks Endowment at the Quad Cities Community Foundation), Bacallao is now All Things Considered host at WPLN Radio in Nashville.
