The Clemson University Plant and Pest Diagnostic Clinic is a multi-disciplinary program which provides diagnoses and recommendations for plant and turf problems, nematodes, weeds, environmental issues, nutritional deficiencies and insect pests of plants. Samples may be submitted through County Extension offices or directly to the laboratory by filling out specific forms. To learn more, Amanda visits with Dr. Joey Williamson of the HGIC and Meg Williamson of the PPDC as they give her a behind the scenes tour of how they help the citizens of South Carolina with their gardening problems.
