July 1, 2020	Honoring Victims of COVID-19	<u>Description:</u> A Massachusetts family has found a patriotic way to honor coronavirus victims. For every person in the state who dies from the virus, the Labbe family has planted a flag in their front yard. There are now 8,013 flags.
Jul 3, 2020	Tax Filing Deadline	<u>Description:</u> And no more delaying – it’s time to do your taxes! The federal government postponed the original April 15 deadline to July 15th due to the coronavirus, and the date is approaching quick! You’ll have to file or seek an extension by the new deadline or face a penalty. The IRS is expecting about 150 million returns from individuals.
Jul 6, 2020	Suicide Prevention	<u>Description:</u> The federal government launched a broad national campaign yesterday aimed at reducing high suicide rates, urging the public to reach out to others especially during the coronavirus pandemic and acknowledge daily stresses in people’s lives. Known as REACH, the government campaign is hitting the internet with the key message that “suicide is preventable” and that collective action not only by government but also by businesses, schools, and churches can overcome the stigma of discussing mental health and empower people to understand risk factors, stay connected with others, and talk openly about problems.
July 8, 2020	Child Safety in Vehicles	<u>Description:</u> When “Lydia” learned about small children losing their lives in hot cars because they are accidentally left behind, she decided to find a solution. The 12-year-old from North Carolina won a \$20,000 prize for her invention; a car seat device that measures the temperature of a car and alerts parents and emergency officials when the temperature inside the car reaches 102 degrees. Lydia's invention, called <i>The Beat the Heat Car Seat</i> is portable, so it can be transferred to other car seats and would cost minimally.
Jul 9, 2020	School Supplies for Underprivileged Children	<u>Description:</u> Two students at Centennial High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth area have launched a campaign to share kindness with students who are in need. “Project Kind Packs” puts together school supplies, storybooks, hygiene items, and letters of encouragement for more than 300 teachers and elementary school students. The goal is to motivate everyone learning at home and help them transition to more normal learning environment in the fall. The students are hoping to raise \$3,000 and have already reached around a third of their goal.
July 10, 2020	Offsetting Food Shortages	<u>Description:</u> “Take what you need, leave what you can!” That’s the message being painted on community refrigerators all across New York City. From Harlem to Brownsville, refrigerators stocked with

They’ll be hosting their second drive-thru job fair Aug. 6, 2020, which has also been designated as National Interview Day.
July 14, 2020	Christmas Hope for Service Members	<u>Description:</u> It may be July, but one New Hampshire woman is already looking ahead to Christmas in hopes of spreading a little love and kindness. Every year, Laura Landerman-Garber collects tens of thousands of holiday greeting cards and mails them to service members around the world. For almost two decades, she’s been collecting written greetings to send to troops around the holidays. Last year, 175,000 cards went out from more than 40 states. She says things will be different this year with the pandemic, but one thing is for sure, the message of hope will never change.
July 15, 2020	Fundraising for Children with Special Needs	<u>Description:</u> A 5-year-old boy with prosthetic legs has raised over 1 and a half million dollars for the London hospital that saved his life by walking 8 miles over several weeks. “Tony” nearly died as a newborn after enduring parental abuse requiring his legs to be amputated. But as a toddler, he persevered with the help of prosthetics and has been walking everyday inspiring other children with special needs.
July 17, 2020	Supporting Law Enforcement	<u>Description:</u> A small-town church in Tennessee is receiving nationwide attention after honoring its local police department in a public ceremony with a gift of \$1,000 for each officer. The congregation, Lighthouse Baptist Church in Jonesboro, Tenn., wanted to encourage the officers in light of criticism they’ve received in recent months. In total, it cost the church \$23,000 to honor Jonesboro’s entire police force of 23 officers. At least one officer donated the \$1,000 to an elderly woman in need so she could pay her utility bills.

This care center is taking to Facebook and posting photos of its residents holding signs printed with their first names and asking, “Will you be my pen pal?” The public is then asked to choose the residents they wanted to correspond with, then mail letters to the care center. In just a matter of weeks, nearly 20,000 letters have come in from around the world — enough to keep every resident writing through the rest of 2020 and beyond.
July 21, 2020	Pancreatic Cancer Awareness	<u>Description:</u> Despite cancer threatening his life, Jeopardy host Alex Trebek and his wife Jean donated over half a million dollars recently to help open two shelters for the homeless in Los Angeles. Each shelter will temporarily hold 25 women and 60 men as they transition to permanent living situations. Trebek has fought stage 4 pancreatic cancer for over a year and repeatedly asked for prayer from his fans... He credits those prayers for the successful shrinking of some of the tumors.
July 22, 2020	Charitable Giving	<u>Description:</u> Despite the growing challenges Americans face in the wake of the pandemic and social unrest, charitable giving has surged nearly 50% in the first half of 2020, according to Schwab Charitable. Generous donors supported more than 100,000 charities, including names like Feeding America, Doctors Without Borders, and the Salvation Army.
July 23, 2020	Meeting the Needs of Military Personnel	<u>Description:</u> A nonprofit that sends sneakers overseas to soldiers in need has seen a surge in donations amid the pandemic. <i>Sneakers for Soldiers</i> now ships 300 pairs of shoes per month to military personnel in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Syria with the help of donations from all parts of the United States. Each shoe is chosen specifically for the soldier and then a label is attached to each pair of sneakers with an encouraging message from the donor.
July 24, 2020	Caring Amidst the Coronavirus	<u>Description:</u> In Anchorage, Alaska, the city known for its cold weather is warming hearts by ensuring its residents are safe during the coronavirus crisis, especially the homeless. And it is thanks in part to a new Facebook group called Coronavirus Days of Caring... they work with local businesses and hotels to get necessities to the newly housed person. One resident says she’s seen an amazing transformation since COVID-19 as people are supporting local businesses and the homeless population is finally being cared for!
