Historical Education: The Holocaust is no longer a part of the regular curriculum in Oregon schools. There are some who believe that without remembering the tragic history of seven decades ago, it likely will happen again.

Health: Antibiotic resistant bacteria are the new bogey-men in medicine. Formerly curable diseases from tuberculosis to gonorrhea are making a new appearance and are increasing resisting most, antibiotics. The question is, what happens when disease no longer responds to therapy?

Addiction: 6 percent of Oregon parents have at least one child who is addicted to alcohol and/or drugs. Many of those parents will lose themselves and their identities struggling with their child's addiction, and end up losing more than just the addicted child.

Terrorist Recruitment: It was once thought that terrorist were a "foreign" problem, when in truth more frequently, the young are being recruited from within our so-called safe borders.

Issue: PTSD and the ongoing war in Iraq

Guests: Chris and Rahnella Adsit, Counselors and Founders of Branches of Valor

Show: PTSD is a major issue for returning vets who have served in Afghanistan and Iraq. It is also an issue for the Kurds in Iraq who are currently fighting ISIS in a fractured Iraq. The Adsits have been treating returning Willamette Valley soldiers from the war on terror and recently visited Iraq to work with Iraqi and Syrian refugees displaced by ISIS/ISIL and to help treat Kurds currently fighting ISIL militants. The Adsits have a unique perspective on those returning from war, and those continuing to fight, and how PTSD affects both.

Guest: Oregon State University Professor Emeritus of Geosciences, Bob Yates

Show: Yates was the first researcher to note the regular 400 year reoccurrence of mega quakes off the coast of Oregon. Much recently has been written in the national media about what a quake in excess of 7.0 would do to the NW. Yates discusses the accuracy of the increased media coverage, and in particular focuses on what the individual needs to do to prepare ones self, and family for a massive quake that scientists believe will happen within the 50 years. Yates also talks about volcanic activity recently discovered on the floor of the Pacific just off the Oregon Coast.

Show: Post WWII was a confusing time in American and World history. Even though the Nazi's had been defeated, and the Allies were bent on bringing war criminals to justice, both the U.S. and Soviet Unions were also interested in using Nazi research and developments for their own ends and some would argue security. Loftis, through years of research has tracked who made it out of Germany to the U.S. and Soviet Union without punishment, and who were tried as war criminals and why. The upshot, even the most amoral researchers were spared.

Issues: The Quality and Safety of Chinese Products

Guest: Paul Midler, Author of Made in China Poorly

Show: As the holidays approach much of the money spent for gifts, will be spent of items made in China. This money will be spent not only on consumer goods, but also food, health, and beauty products. Midler, who spent years acting as a go-between for American importers and Chinese companies, says the perceived lack of quality of Chinese products is accurate, and much of it has to do with cultural differences. Midler says Chinese manufacturers believe in the axiom "you get what you pay for" and if a product sort of works, it is as good as working. Midler claims another part of the problem is American companies contracting with Chinese companies do a poor job of quality oversight, and in many cases an even poorer job in explaining what they really want.

Issue: Dealing with Drug and Alcohol Addicted Children

Guest: Charles Rueben, Author of Don't Let Your Children Kill You: A Guide for Parents of Drug and Alcohol Addicted Children.

Show: Oregon has a higher than national average rate of children who are addicted to drugs or alcohol. It is an issue that about 6 percent of Oregon parents deal with daily. Rueben, who had two addicted children, says that parents of addicted kids many times lose themselves in their child's addiction. It is common for parents to neglect themselves and normally blame themselves for circumstances that are out of their control. Rueben's belief is that for a parent to deal with an addicted child, the parent has to take care of their own self interests first, or the child's addiction can and will destroy the parent's life too.

Issue: Rape on Oregon College Campuses

Guests: Attorneys Mike Arnold and Kevin Boondy

Show: Both Oregon State University and the University of Oregon have recently been sued because of alleged rapes involving their athletic programs. Beyond the public scrutiny and criminal aspect of the alleged crimes, the issue is complicated by Title IX. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in any education program or activity that receives federal funding. Sex discrimination includes sexual harassment, sexual battery, sexual assault, and rape that are "so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it effectively bars the victim's access to an educational opportunity or benefit." Even a single instance of rape or sexual assault by another student, faculty, or staff member could meet this standard. Arnold and Boondy discuss the differences and similarities between the two universities lawsuits and the larger picture of how they deal with Title IX complexities.

Guest: Haseem Hafeez, former Al Qaeda recruit and terrorist trainee

Show: Hafeez was a Pakistani child growing up in the suburbs of Portland, Oregon when he began his descent into extremism. As Muslim teenager, Hafeez was recruited online to join Al-Qaeda and he went through indoctrination, and training to become a human weapon of terrorism after ending up in Europe. Hafeez says he was taught to despise the Jews, and was taught that Israel and its citizenry were evil. Hafeez says he wanted to "learn more about his enemy" and traveled to Israel to view its people personally, and study the culture. Hafeez says that he had an epiphany and realized he had made a mistake. Hafeez discusses how impressionable Muslim youth are approached and sucked into extremism both personally, and online, and how recruits are subtly brainwashed.

Dye discusses how Ebola may potentially never go away in those that survive it, living forever in their systems with the possibility of becoming active again, or being transmitted to others through sexual activity. Dye also talks about what he believes is the bigger concern, antibiotic resistant bacteria. Dye believes the next approach in fighting super-bugs is potentially creating other bacteria or viruses in the lab to kill the bad bugs.

Show: Irving Roth and his family were living in Europe during the rise of Hitler. The Jewish Family attempted to escape Europe, but were captured. Roth was in both Auschwitz and Buchenwald, and lost most of his family. Roth discusses the need to continue teaching the Holocaust in schools, which is no longer a part of the regular curriculum in Oregon, and how he believes in some parts of the world history may actually be repeating itself. Roth believes that remaining holocaust survivors need to spent their last remaining time on this plane being a warning from the past.
