Issue: Environmental Issues

Program Overview: A big topic in Door and Kewaunee County concerns groundwater issues as they relate to manure spreading. During our news segments, we talked to farmers who spread manure and to people who are affected by manure spreading. Kewaunee County passed legislation banning manure spreading for close to four months to start the year in some areas and conducted a series of workgroup meetings with various stakeholders trying to find a solution to all of the problems going on in the area. In Door County, the discussion was dominated by the discussion to drain the Forestville Millpond. Supporters says it will help improve the water in there and eliminate invasive species. Opponents say it will ruin the ecosystem and release more nutrients into an already impaired waterway.
