THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL IS URGING THE U-S SUPREME COURT TO UPHOLD OHIO'S BAN ON SAME-SEX MARRIAGE. THE COURT VOTED 5-4 BACK IN 20-13 TO STRIKE DOWN AS 'UNCONSTITUTIONAL' A FEDERAL LAW THAT DEFINED MARRIAGE AS BETWEEN A MAN AND A WOMAN.
