Program Title: "April - Time to Start Your Garden Seeds" - Strong Tower Radio Today

Program Substance: April is the month to start preparing your garden soil for the planting of seeds and plants. It is beneficial to till under any above ground last year plants. You can refer to a seed temperature chart and a soil monitor to do this preparation. Plant your cool season crops such as onions, beets, lettuce, spinach, carrots and radishes. It is also time to prune your ornamental trees/shrubs and fruit trees, but do last pruning on your stone fruit trees such as cherries, peaches, plums, etc. It is also time to treat your lawn for the grubs, especially if you had this problem last year. If you have them, you will see birds, squirrels and other animals in your yard digging and scratching the surface to pull the larva up to devour them. Crab grass is also a problem so watch for open spaces in your lawn and do not cut your grass real low as that is where crab grass will germinate. Be prepared to get rid of all kinds of ants - carpenter ants, feral ants, plus others. Put out some ant killer food as they will then take it back to their colony to feed the entire group and they will die from eating this so you can very quickly get rid of ants in and around your home.

In the church version of the book Ron shares that P stands for Pray, L-Love yourselves as you do your neighbor, A-Accept others, Y-Yield to God's will, N-Now is the time for restoration and resolution, I-Identify the basis of the real conflict, C- Chose to remain civil and Christ like, E-Embrace conflict as an opportunity.

Bats are mammals, and they are very interesting critters. There are 1400species of bats and they do use echo to fly. There are two basic groups of bats, micro and macro bats with Michigan brown bats (size of a mouse) in the micro group. Their diet is mainly bugs and they eat approximately 600 mosquitos per hour- what great pest control. The macro bat is larger with a wing-span of up to 6 feet. They hang upside down as they cannot obtain flight from the ground, but if falling to the ground they can start to fly. Bat droppings is an excellent plant fertilizer as it is high in nitrogen, phosphorus,, and potassium.

We use it for furniture, human food, animal food, antibiotics, rubber for tires, batteries coating for pills and vitamins.

Kevin Jacobs of the DNR Air Patrol described what happened on June 3<sup>rd</sup> in Grayling, MI when a wildfire

was called into his office. He shared the initial response to a fire and how his team worked to put out that fire as they had done some many in the past. During a wildfire Kevin and his fellow pilots are in the air, giving specific, accurate information to the firefighters on the ground. He also shared the surveys they do of wild life when the fire season is not so active as well as the programs they help with to determine animal populations as well as other natural data.

The second part of the interview included Randy Hartman, DNR Fire officer, who shared the intricacies of a firefighter on the ground, on the front line of a wildfire and what it takes to put the fire out without loss of life, property and natural resources. Randy also described the huge machinery they use in working to manage and extinguish a fire.

Debra Ann Brabazon from the USDA Forrest Service listed to top 3 causes of wildfires as debris burning, equipment and campfires. Burning household trash containing plastic and other caustic materials pollute the air and water. Alternative to burning can be recycling, composting leaves and food scraps, donating household goods or a dumpster.

The National Weather Service has a great website for finding out if it is safe to burn in your area. If you do burn make sure the area is safe to burn in, the fire is small not tall and only burn organic matter. The Insurance Institute has a book for businesses and homes called, “Protect your property from Wildfire” which is very helpful. You can also Google “Ready, Set, Go”, for helpful tips on how to plan for a wildfire.
