- 1. TSU Summer Camps: (June 4, 2018, 8am-:30)** – At Tarleton State University this June and July, students can participate in several unique, hands-on learning opportunities. There are band and choir camps, cooking camps and camps for science, technology, engineering and math, or STEM fields, on Tarleton's Stephenville campus. Up first, band students can sharpen young musician's skills while preparing for a concert at camp's end. It begins this Sunday, June 10th through 13th for junior high students and June 16th to 19th for high schoolers. - 2. Comanche Rodeo Coming Friday & Saturday: (June 13, 2018, 8am-:30)** – The Comanche Roping Club brings you the 77th annual COMANCHE RODEO, this Friday and Saturday. Sarah Peacock, her band, and the Bosephus bus are back for a pre-rodeo kickoff party at the Stone Eagle Beer Garden, Friday at 8pm. The annual parade is Saturday at 4:30 pm, and match roping and barrel race between the top finishers from the Comanche Jr Rodeo on Saturday night. Adult advanced sale tickets are \$8, or \$4 for kids from Scholarship participants Sofia Jimenez, Kailei Gaines, or Judith Moreno. Gate prices are \$10 per Adult and \$5 per child. Kids 5 and under are welcome for free.
- 3. The Bloodhound and the Bad Guy: (June 22, 2018, 8am-:30)** The Erath County Sheriff's Office employed a not-so-new weapon with a storied past in American law enforcement to catch a bad guy on Tuesday, when a bloodhound named Pearl and her handler, Deputy Erick Reynolds, helped catch a teenage thief. 17-year-old Michael Ramsey was arrested after breaking into his grandparent's barn on CR 567 to steal gasoline and personal information that investigators believe he planned to sell. Ramsey's grandparents called authorities to report the theft. Pearl helped investigators link Ramsey to the scene of the crime. He's being held at the Erath County Jail.
- 4. Williams Says Tax Cuts Are Working: (June 23, 2018, 8am-:30)** Texas' 25th District Congressman and House Financial Services Committee member Roger Williams says in an opinion piece that unemployment is down and wages are up thanks to the Tax Cut and Jobs Act. The unemployment rate dropped below 4 percent for the first time since 2000, and he claims 90 percent of Americans are seeing more money in their paychecks. However, Florida Republican Sen. Marco Rubio doubts the actual benefits to workers, saying it's primarily a boost in stock buybacks for shareholders. The Bureau of Labor Statistics shows employee earnings since the tax cuts are well short of those projected by President Donald Trump.
