The state has a \$42 billion deficit. In the governor's State of the State address, he announced lawmakers will not receive pay until they reach an agreement on the budget. Lawmakers were at a budget stalemate for 106 days. During this time the state issued residents their state tax refund through IOU's. Payments to programs for the elderly, disabled, childcare and students were put on hold. Government employees were subject to furloughs in order to save state funds. The Governor sent 20,000 layoff notices to state employees. When the new budget was passed, state lawmakers created \$12.5 billion in revenues by increasing sales tax, vehicle license fees, income tax and reducing dependent credits. Even after the new budget, analysts still predict a \$6 billion deficit next year.</p>
