However, the storm is expected to intensify before it makes landfall in South Carolina tomorrow. FEMA says search and rescue teams are out in several cities. More than 2 and a half million of us are without power across the state. The beaches along the west coast are closed. Naples Pier is also closed. Storm surge was higher than the pier and caused significant damage. In Fort Myers, traffic lights are still out, power lines are down, and many reports of homes destroyed, and roadways flooded. The Department of Homeland Security has activated their workforce to deploy personnel to assist in some of the hardest hit areas. In Tampa, the Skyway bridge has reopened to traffic in both directions. We're continuing to pray for you and your safety.
