Last month, we were all introduced to a new concept...“social distancing.” Urged, and even required in places, to maintain physical distance and reduce close contact with other people, our collective goal has been to slow the spread of COVID-19 and keep it from overwhelming our health care system. There’s a very real problem with this strategy, however. While social distancing may be the best way to fight the coronavirus, it may very well exacerbate an already existing epidemic: loneliness. As former Surgeon General Vivek Murthy put it, “We live in the most technologically connected age in the history of civilization, yet rates of loneliness have doubled since the 1980s.” The health impact of this loneliness epidemic is incredible. According to Murthy, “the impact of social isolation and loneliness on longevity equals that of smoking 15 cigarettes a day and exceeds the risks associated with obesity, excessive alcohol consumption and lack of exercise.” . A 2019 YouGov survey found that “27 percent of millennials have no close friends, 25 percent have no ‘acquaintances’ and 22 percent . . . have no buddies at all.” In fact, Generation Z may be the loneliest generation on record. According to a 2018 Cigna survey, those born in 1995 or later report greater feelings of loneliness and worse health than any other generation. If social media could make up for the lack of actual human contact, as we were promised, the generation most at ease with social media isn’t showing it. Apparently, “digital natives” are lonelier than the Baby Boomers they love to turn into memes. And again, all of this was true before social distancing went into effect. So, during the next few months, the face-to-face activities that build relationships and keep loneliness at bay will be difficult; in some cases impossible.

I’m not saying there aren’t challenges, of course. As one of the more helpful memes puts it, with a wistful Forrest Gump looking into space, “And just like that, no one ever asked again what a stay-at-home mom does all day.” One group of parents we should especially keep in mind at this time is the group least likely to constantly remind us what they are going through, if for no other reason than they’re simply too busy. I’m talking of parents of children with autism and other developmental disabilities. With most, if not all, special education programs and services suspended indefinitely, these parents are even busier than usual. Many of us haven’t fully thought through what makes “special education,” well, so “special.” The goal of special education is to “help individuals with special needs achieve a higher level of personal self-sufficiency and success in school and in their community...” While that includes academic subjects, those with developmental disorders need to learn essential skills that other children can often learn by imitating parents and their peers, including basic social skills. Children with Down Syndrome present different kinds of challenges, which also require the training and expertise of others that many parents rely on. In addition to losing these services, studies indicate that “respiratory tract infections (viral and bacterial) do appear to be more common in most young people with Down’s Syndrome.” Imagine the anxiety and stress being felt by parents of these kids in the age of COVID-19. First, we can pray for these families. Second, we can ask the parents we know in these situations how we can help them.

They faced the many challenges – lack of personal protection equipment for staff, widespread job losses for developmentally disabled persons, difficulty in helping residents adjust to Covid-19 changes to their lives and routines and the impossibility of following social distancing rules in group home settings – where residents may lack the capacity to understand or follow the rules.

The 2020 Academy Award for best short subject documentary went to “Learning to Skateboard in a War Zone.” The film tells the story of “Afghan girls who learn to skate through a program run by a Berlin-based NGO.” The NGO’s stated mission is to train young people to “become leaders for a better world,” through a combination of skateboarding lessons as well as “creative, arts-based education.” However, one person not enthralled by the film was Sahar Ghumkhor, a social scientist from the University of Melbourne. Writing for Al Jazeera, Ghumkhor called the film an example of “white savior” syndrome. Though that’s jarring term that too often gets thrown around indiscriminately, it does capture an underlying cultural attitude of those who see people in the developing world as victims of an “inherent backwardness.” These are people who need saving, not just from sickness, or drought, or poverty, but from a way of life, specifically their traditional ways of thinking — typically about things like the role of sexual morality, gender and marriage roles, and the emphasis on “community norms” over “individual desire.” In this case, teaching Afghan girls how to skateboard and providing “creative, arts-based education,” is, in the end, shorthand for making them more “Western” in their views about women, and thus, less “backward.” The hoped-for end products “are artists, hipsters, [and] rebels with a cause, who are often introduced as trailblazers.” Reading Ghumkhor’s piece, it becomes clear that many of these NGO’s are nothing less than “secular missionaries.” Of course, Christian missionaries are the ones so bad ideas about native peoples and bad behavior by those tasked with bringing the Good News to them. Still, today, its Western liberal secularists leading the way in being judgmental and dismissive of native cultures.

Outrage erupted across the country this week after video surfaced of Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin kneeling on the neck of George Floyd for nearly 10 minutes. In the horrifying video, Floyd begs for air before bystanders plead for his life. In the end, Floyd, an African American suspected of no violent crime but of “grocery store forgery,” died. The four police officers involved were fired almost immediately. The FBI opened an investigation, and the Justice Department pledged to make the case a top priority. While, in the past, police have often defended fellow officers in similar incidents, this time, as the Washington Post reported, police chiefs across the country “denounced the prolonged suffocation of Floyd. We must say, first, that George Floyd was an image bearer of His Creator. His death is awful. It’s tragic. And it should not have happened. Floyd’s murder has opened up, yet again, so many larger, painful cultural issues we face—especially those having to do with race. Also revealed, again and painfully so, is how essential justice is, especially for victims and family members but also entire communities. Civilizations can sustain many things, but not when perpetual injustices go unaddressed. Above all, I, a follower of Jesus who happens to be white, can listen. I can, indeed if I am to love my neighbor as Christ commanded I must, care about the suffering of my fellow citizens, especially my brothers and sisters in Christ. The Church can lead the culture in addressing this suffering *and* its root causes, advancing justice, and caring for victims. Who else can?

Who do I call?" The Councilwoman's response, that the ability to call for help in the first place was a matter of "white privilege," was, shall we say, less than enlightening. Abolishing police is the stuff of utopian fantasies, only possible in worlds without evildoers. Because such worlds do not exist, law enforcement of some kind, at least here on Earth, will always be necessary. To think otherwise is to misunderstand the human condition. "The line separating good and evil," wrote Solzhenitsyn, "passes not through states, nor classes, nor political parties." Neither does it pass through occupations, as if policemen are intrinsically "evil," while social workers or teachers or protesters are intrinsically "good." House Majority Whip James Clyburn, a veteran of the Civil Rights movement, worries that calls to defund or abolish the police could "hijack the momentum to make serious police reforms in the wake of George Floyd's death." As he put it, "if you mean reimagining policing, say *that*."

Yesterday, in a 5-4 decision, the Supreme Court struck down a Louisiana law that would have required abortion doctors to have admitting privileges at a nearby hospital. Not only did Chief Justice John Roberts side with the more liberal justices *again*, he also gave pro-lifers reasons to doubt *Roe* would ever be overturned during his tenure. According to media outlets and the court majority, this case, *June Medical Services v. Russo*, was essentially "identical" to a Texas law the Court struck down in 2016. In that case, *Whole Women's Health v. Hellerstedt*, the Court ruled that requiring providers to have admitting privileges places an undue burden on women who wanted to access abortion services. Every Constitutional right, even legitimate ones such as the freedom of speech or religion, is subject to limitations. Any restriction on abortion, however, is considered a mortal threat to "women's rights," cast as part of a "war on women," and considered a violation of so-called "settled law." On Monday, the Chief Justice added the sheen of "fidelity to precedent."
