## **Crime**

### **07/01/2015 Overnight Stabbing**

**Duration: 0:32**

Wichita Police tell us they were called to Via Christi in the overnight hours for a stabbing. According to the WPD two witnesses took a 34 year old man to the hospital after being stabbed allegedly by a 20 year old woman. At this point, officials believe it happened at the 1100 block of North Broadway, and that the victim and the suspect knew each other. The victim was rushed to surgery in critical condition, police are still waiting to interview him to continue their investigation.

### **07/12/2015 Grove Shooting**

**Duration: 0:16**

Police say a man is going to be okay after being shot in the leg outside his home just after 1 am. The 50 year old victim tells police he was approached by two unknown men outside his home near 21<sup>st</sup> and Grove. The men began firing shots at him. Police found 14 shell casings in the area but say the victim was hit just once. No one has been arrested.

### **07/26/2015 Battery of a Police Horse**

A woman is accused of battery of a police animal after interfering with an officer's horse in Old Town around 2 am. Police say a 30 year old woman ran up to the officers on North Mosely who were arresting a suspect police say she grabbed justice the horses reins when other officers came to help the mounted officer police say the suspect resisted arrest. Even kicking and punching an officer while in the back of the police car. She faces battery of both a police officer, and a police animal and resisting arrest. Justice the horse was not hurt.

A murder suspect on the run for almost a year is behind bars. Samuel Darrah of McPherson has been wanted for killing a man in November of last year near Galva, Ks. Police received a tip that Darrah was living in Wichita. When they went to check the house, officers found Darrah living inside a false wall in the 800-block of South Lorraine. Two others were previously arrested for their connection in the case.

Today, jurors will begin the punishment phase for the man who shot and killed three people at Jewish sites in Kansas City last year. It took a jury less than two hours to find Frazier Glenn Miller Junior guilty. The self-proclaimed white supremacist admitted to the killings but argued that he was compelled to do it. He faces the death penalty for those murders.

A man is still in critical condition after being shot by a deputy, but the sheriff says the deputy was defending himself. It happened near 31<sup>st</sup> Street South in Eastern Sedgwick County around 4:20 Tuesday. The deputy was called out to the area to investigate a suspicious character the deputy saw a man walking in to a ditch with a gun, and asked him to put it down eleven times and to stop advancing four times. The sheriff released pictures from the deputy's dash camera, in them you can see the suspect pointing what officers now say was a high powered pellet gun at the deputy.

The Wichita fire department is investigating a pair of car arsons on the same block where several cars were recently set on fire. Wichita fire investigators say the latest fires started around 1am in the 2200 block of South Osage. Just two weeks ago, another car was set on fire five houses down from the recent incident fire investigators confirm they are both arson, but they don't have any evidence to link the two. The Wichita fire department is working with the Wichita Police Dept. to investigate.
