1. Agriculture—Our newsroom spoke with Mike Jaspers, the newly-appointed Secretary of Agriculture for South Dakota about why he's a good fit for the job, and the importance of agriculture to the state's economy. Aired on June 8th at Noon and 5:00 pm. Duration 10 minutes.

Agriculture—The non-profit organization Farm Aid looks to expand its reach into more states by raising additional money. North Dakota-based Farm Aid does physical labor for farmers in need in the Dakotas, Minnesota, Iowa and eastern Montana. Aired on June 30th at 12:00 pm and 5:00 pm. Duration 10 minutes.

2. Government--The Watertown City Council rejects a planned new residential development on Lake Kampeska due to concerns a proposed channel would have on the water quality of the lake. Aired on May 17th at 7:50 am, 8:50 am and 12:00 pm. Duration 10 minutes.
