CRIME AND SAFETY

- Oct. 3, 5 p.m. 7:17: AUGUSTA, Ga. After a deadly police pursuit took the life of a mother of two, the I-TEAM is digging deeper into the numbers of deadly pursuits in our area, and how the Richmond County Sheriff's Office is reviewing them. Earlier this year, the I-TEAM uncovered new information about a deadly police chase that killed Ashley Irvin. She was an innocent bystander, driving to her parents' house around the corner when she was hit and killed.

 Oct. 4, 8 a.m. 2;41: AUGUSTA, Ga. Augusta Commission members toured the Charles B. Webster Detention Center on Wednesday amid several reports of issues with jail conditions. Conditions within the jail have been addressed by the commission several times, with the first reports starting at the beginning of the year.
- Oct. 5, 5 p.m. 6:41: AUGUSTA, Ga. Georgia's occupational licensing commission is made up of lawmakers, members of local chambers of commerce and experts in fields that require licenses to work. Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger created the Georgia Works Commission in the spring with the goal of streamlining the licensing process.
- Oct. 11, 6 a.m. 2:55: WASHINGTON, D.C. Hundreds of thousands of those who fought for our country are fighting another battle: one for benefits. New numbers show the Department of Veterans Affairs' backlog of claims has surpassed 300,000. This number represents claims that have been pending for more than 125 days, so we aren't talking about the ones that are brand new.
- Oct. 11, 10 a.m. 2:25: AUGUSTA, Ga. Augusta Commission members held a work session on Wednesday on how best to address panhandling in the city. City leaders have recently proposed ordinances seeking to curb the practice, but they were warned by legal staff not to follow their initial course because it's unconstitutional.
- Oct. 12, 4 p.m. 4:49: AUGUSTA, Ga. Our I-TEAM has uncovered new information about a sex scandal at the Richmond County Sheriff's Office. So far, two deputies have been fired and two others have been demoted in a pair of separate incidents.
- Oct. 14, 9 p.m. 2:01: AIKEN COUNTY, S.C. Two people have been taken into custody and a suspect is dead following a traffic stop by Edgefield County that turned into a full-on chase. Just after 7:30 p.m. Saturday, News 12 began receiving tips about a heavy police presence in South Carolina around Exit 18 on I-20.
- Oct. 15, 9 p.m. 1:13: BLYTHE, Ga. Arrest warrants from the Richmond County Sheriff's Office detail "severe injuries" that left a 6-week-old boy in critical condition and got his parents arrested. On Wednesday, the Richmond County Sheriff's Office arrested 19-year-old Emma

- Pittman and 35-year-old David James with charges of cruelty to children in the first degree and aggravated battery for both.
- Oct. 17, 11 a.m. 4:12: AUGUSTA, Ga. Granting the wish of a Richmond County deputy who was shot in the face, a judge denied bond to the suspect during a hearing Tuesday that revealed more details about the encounter than we've ever learned. The deputy, Michael Cole, was at the bond hearing Tuesday morning.
- Oct. 17, 7 p.m. 1:59: AUGUSTA, Ga. We're learning more about a drive-by shooting that injured four people at a grocery store in a part of Augusta that's seen more than its fair share of violence. The shooting happened Tuesday evening at Paul's IGA on Greene Street at East Boundary. On Wednesday, the windows were shattered from what witnesses said were rounds from a machine gun.
- Oct. 19, 12 p.m. 1:47: AUGUSTA, Ga. For a number of Augusta Commission meetings, representatives from hotels in Augusta have been voicing their complaints about guests overstaying their welcome, and the need for the city to step in. We're talking about people who've been living in these hotels for weeks or months without paying.
- **Oct. 21. 2 p.m. 0:33: WADLEY, Ga.** The Georgia Bureau of Investigation is looking into a shooting incident with Jefferson County deputies that sent one person to the hospital. On Saturday at 10:07 a.m., the Wadley Police Department responded to a 911 call in the 700 block of North Main Street regarding an individual pointing a firearm at passing cars.
- Oct. 22, 8 p.m. 0:43: AUGUSTA, Ga. A driver has been arrested in connection with one of two fatal traffic accidents that happened over the weekend. It was the latest deadly weekend in a bad stretch for Richmond County. Over the previous weekend, two pedestrians were killed in crashes, and two pedestrians were killed a week earlier. Meagan Monica Burton, 32, was arrested Sunday in connection with a traffic accident in the 1800 block of Gordon Highway.
- **Oct. 23, 4 p.m. 1:39: SANDERSVILLE, Ga.** A hearing began Monday in Washington County court for a prisoner fighting what Georgia Innocence Project calls his wrongful conviction. The evidentiary hearing will continue Tuesday in support of Erik Heard's habeas corpus petition.
- Oct. 24, 3 p.m. 0:50: WAGENER, S.C. Controversy continues for the Wagener Fire Department, where the fire chief resigned last week after being accused of fraud and breach of trust for alleged paycheck padding. In the latest incident, a woman was arrested on two counts of third-degree assault and battery after some issues at a Halloween corn maze staged by the agency.
- Oct. 24, 4 p.m. 2:54: SANDERSVILLE, Ga. Tuesday marked a second day of testimony in a hearing for a prisoner fighting what Georgia Innocence Project calls his wrongful conviction. It won't be the hearing's last day. The evidentiary hearing began Monday and continued Tuesday, but it will need to go on longer, probably at a time to be determined in the future.
- Oct. 26, 5 p.m. 7:27: AUGUSTA, Ga. The I-TEAM recently uncovered sex scandals between deputies in the Richmond County Sheriff's Office but those aren't the only scandals. We've uncovered another one. Unlike the other cases, this one didn't involve a relationship between two deputies; this one involved a deputy and a woman who called 911.
- **Oct. 30, 5 p.m. 5:42: AUGUSTA, Ga.** If you have kids, Tuesday is a big night. Halloween means bags of candy after going door to door. But some companies are copycatting the popular candies. And these treats are tricking kids into more than a sugar high.

- Nov. 1, 3 p.m. 2:21: AUGUSTA, Ga. We're starting to put more pieces together in the case of a man accused of murdering someone and then burying the body in a shallow grave in his backyard. Colby Jovan Smith, 30, was detained on the scene after the body was found Monday in the 800 block of Heard Avenue, nearly a month after the murder. Smith remained in Richmond County jail on Wednesday on charges of murder and concealing a death.
- Nov. 2, 8 a.m. 2:07: AUGUSTA, Ga. Shocked customers watched in the drive-thru at an Augusta Chick-fil-A when a driver shot at a homeless man who tried to get into his car. No one was hurt, but the homeless man was arrested and customers' nerves were rattled. The drama unfolded around 6 p.m. Wednesday at 3130 Peach Orchard Road.
- **Nov. 2, 4 p.m. 2:23: AUGUSTA, Ga.** Georgia is no stranger to a high number of car accidents. In 2020, more than 331,000 were reported in the state, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The Richmond County Sheriff's Office said they've responded to roughly 9,000 car accidents this year alone and more than 1,300 are hit-and-runs.
- **Nov. 2, 11 a.m. 1:34:** EVANS, Ga. A jury found Damione Aaron Evans guilty Thursday in the trial over a 2016 rape and robbery in Columbia County. Thursday started out with closing arguments from the defense, pleading with the jury to not deliver a guilty verdict for Evans. The case dates back to seven years ago, which was the defense's biggest argument, calling it an injustice to try a case after such a long period of time.
- Nov. 5, 5 p.m. 2:30: AUGUSTA, Ga. Food truck owners are coming to together to help a local vendor who lost his trailer in a fire over the weekend. A fire broke out Sunday evening at Augusta's Foodees Festival near the Fifth Street bridge. Around 5:30 p.m., a News 12 reporter on scene at Augusta's Foodees Festival caught a photo of a food truck fire that broke out.
- Nov. 5, 3 p.m. 0:17: AUGUSTA, Ga. The Richmond County Sheriff's Office is investigating a shooting that happened Sunday afternoon in south Augusta that left one person injured. On Sunday, the Richmond County Sheriff's Office says deputies responded to the 3600 block of Goldfinch Drive at 1:53 p.m. in reference to shots fired with one person being shot.
- Nov. 5 p.m. 1:48 NORTH AUGUSTA, S.C. Captain Junior Johnson begins his role as chief of North Augusta Public Safety on Jan. 1. He was <u>announced as the new chief on Nov. 15.</u> Current Chief John Thomas took over the position in 2009 and started with over 20 years of experience in the field. He announced his end-of-the-year retirement in September. Johnson says he has big shoes to fill.
- **Nov. 7, 5 p.m. 2:03: HARLEM, Ga.** On Tuesday, a proposed county construction project is causing a headache for families in Harlem. Right now, the county is buying land for the Euchee Creek Interceptor Sewer Line Project. If plans move forward, backyards and walking trails will be impacted.

- **Nov. 9, 6 p.m. 5:41: LINCOLNTON, Ga.** Federal prosecutors in Minnesota are wrapping up a trial that involved companies taking more than \$300 million from seniors across the country. Those victims were typical seniors or other vulnerable individuals. For Penny Mashburn and her family, nearly \$70,000 could've been life-changing money.
- Nov. 9, 8 p.m. 2:45: AUGUSTA, Ga. Ten days ago, a suspicious activity call to 911 ended with the discovery of a body on Heard Avenue. The body was in a shallow hole covered with a blue tarp. Investigators haven't released the name of the victim, but we are learning more details about the man accused of killing him. Colby Jovan Smith, 30, had two warrants for his arrest at the time of the murder.
- Nov. 13, 3 p.m. 1:40: AlKEN COUNTY, S.C. It's an issue we see in multiple neighborhoods across the CSRA: concerns and the need for a traffic light. This time, it's off Ascauga Lake Road in Aiken County at the intersection of Blanchard Road. It's a heavily traveled road already, but being near new construction like Highland Springs Middle School, traffic is a huge concern for so many families who travel that way daily.
- Nov. 13, 3 p.m. 1:48: AUGUSTA, Ga. An escapee is back in Bibb County after being captured over the weekend in a raid that shook an Augusta neighborhood and shocked neighbors. Just after 8 a.m. Sunday at a home in the 3000 block of Alpine Road in Augusta, authorities captured 37-year-old Johnifer Dernard Barnwell in a <u>raid that shocked many of the neighbors</u>. Our cameras were the only ones rolling while deputies searched for evidence.
- Nov. 13, 2 p.m. 1:50: AUGUSTA, Ga. The well-battered Olive Road bridge has been struck again by a vehicle. This time, it happened around Monday morning, according to railroad employees. By afternoon, Olive Road was blocked by barriers on both sides of the notoriously low railroad overpass. The bridge usually has to be inspected for damage and sometimes repaired before the road can reopen after a crash.
- Nov. 13, 12 p.m. 3:43: AUGUSTA, Ga. A lawsuit alleges "grossly negligent" and reckless acts led to the death of a mental health patient who wasted away in Bamberg County jail, where he was kept instead of being sent for psychiatric care that was ordered for him. The lawsuit alleges Alan R. Thibodeau died because the jail failed to secure the needed medical attention and medications.
- Nov. 14, 3 p.m. 3:18: AUGUSTA, Ga. Richmond County is seeing a high number of pedestrian deaths this year alone. 2020 was our highest year, but we're on track to surpass that, even though the deaths seem to come in peaks in valleys, like two mid-October weekends that each had two fatalities. Of 54 pedestrian deaths from 2018 to 2023, we've learned that 60% of those deaths happened in the same ZIP code, 30906.
- Nov. 14, 3 p.m. 2:24: AUGUSTA, Ga. The problem of veteran homelessness remains profound despite improvements in recent years. That's why the Department of Veterans Affairs reached out with the Homeless Veteran Stand Down, not only meant to get veterans daily needed items

like toiletries but also to put them on a path off the streets. VA is on track to permanently house 38,000 homeless veterans this year, having reached 26,470 through July.

- Nov. 15, 7 p.m. 3:04: AUGUSTA, Ga. For the first time, we are hearing from the family of a Bamberg County inmate with mental health issues who died in the hospital after dropping 77 pounds in five months. On Monday, we told you his family filed a lawsuit against Bamberg County claiming grossly negligent treatment of their loved one. It claims in five months, he wasted away in jail despite being ordered to go to a psychiatric hospital.
- Nov. 20, 5 p.m. 10:08: AUGUSTA, Ga. This February marks four years since the night deputy Brandon Keathley struck deputy Nick Nunes in the back of the head with a flashlight as they were working to perform CPR on a 17-year-old dying from gunshot wounds. A grand jury indicted Keathley.
- Nov. 20, 2 p.m. 1:58: AUGUSTA, Ga. It's been three years since the death of 33-year-old Felycya Harris, who identified as a transgender woman. She was found shot to death on Meadowlark Drive. Two years ago on Nov. 20, deputies arrested a suspect- 30-year-old Jerrome Tyvone Miller.
- Nov. 20, 12 p.m. 2:06: THOMSON, Ga. Authorities have identified the teenage boy who died after being shot in Thomson last week. Jonathan Johnson, 14, of Thomson, was shot in the head around 6:30 p.m. last Tuesday in the 500 block of Anderson Avenue. He succumbed to his injuries at 11:31 a.m. Saturday an Augusta hospital.
- Nov. 21, 10 p.m. 2:11: THOMSON, Ga. It's been one week since a shootout in Thomson that killed 14-year-old Jonathan Johnson. The Georgia Bureau of Investigations announced Tuesday three teenagers are behind bars in connection to the felony murder of Johnson. Two of those teenagers are also facing gang charges. The shooting is now expanding the push for more resources for teenagers in the area.
- Nov. 21, 6 p.m. 5:15: WAYNESBORO, Ga. Hundreds of local families lost financial help with child care over the last two months. Across the state, it adds up to thousands. This comes after pandemic money to daycares stopped and deductibles in Georgia's child-care subsidy program went into effect.
- Nov. 26, 6 p.m. 2:34: AIKEN, S.C. A second shooting at the Walmart on Whiskey Road has raised concern among neighbors in Aiken. A person was injured in Sunday's shooting at the same Walmart where a 13-year-old girl was injured in a shooting in June. The latest shooting happened during an altercation in the parking lot, according to the Aiken Department of Public Safety.
- Nov. 26, 6 p.m. 2:34: AlKEN, S.C. A person was injured in a shooting Sunday at the Whiskey Road Walmart in Aiken the same one where a 13-year-old girl was injured in a shooting in June. The latest shooting happened during an altercation in the parking lot, according to the Aiken

Department of Public Safety. The report came in at 4:35 p.m., and arriving officers learned there had been an altercation among several people.

- Nov. 27, 1 p.m. 2:00: AUGUSTA, Ga. As the temperature gets lower, concerns are getting higher about the well-being of Augusta's homeless population. The need to address homelessness in Augusta is pushing others outside typical leadership to tackle the issue. Brian Green went before Augusta Commission members a few weeks ago asking for tens of thousands of dollars to start his own program.
- Nov. 27, 2 p.m. 2:29: AUGUSTA, Ga. Coming on the heels of a holiday weekend that brought three fatal shootings across the CSRA, the Richmond County Sheriff's Office Gang Unit is speaking about the rise in crime. One major thing the deputies wanted to highlight is that gang activity is spiking here and it's only going to get worse.
- Nov. 28, 3 p.m. 1:46: AUGUSTA, Ga. A fragile truce between Israel and Hamas continues to hold, but analysts warn the war is far from over. Hostages from both sides have been released with diplomats from both sides working to extend the ceasefire for another day. Here at home, two locals escaped the conflict and are now safely back home.
- Nov. 28, 5 p.m. 2:18: AUGUSTA, Ga. Zykee Ryans almost made it to 5 years old, but a bullet cut his brief life even shorter. Still, friends and family wanted to mark the occasion, so they held a balloon release on his birthday Tuesday. They remembered him as a boy who loved superheroes especially Spider-Man and who was a shining light in their lives.
- Nov. 30, 11 a.m. 0:32: AUGUSTA, Ga. The GBI says it's finished its investigation on the Richmond County deputy who <u>fatally shot himself while under investigation</u> over criminal allegations. Investigator Brian Manecke was found dead in his car by the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office back in September.
- Nov. 30, 4 p.m. 1:50: AUGUSTA, Ga. We're in the thick of the holiday shopping season and that means scammers are doing their best to separate you from your well-earned money. Scams are all over the place and the CSRA is no different. Will Rogers is a private wealth adviser and even he said he almost fell victim to a scam on Facebook.
- Nov. 30, 5 p.m. 7:50 AUGUSTA, Ga. An internal investigation of the Waynesboro Police Department finds "no evidence" officers violated policy when investigating the alleged crimes of Gery Flakes Jr. and Daniel Nunn. AMZ Investigations, LLC, conducted it after attorney Edward Tarver filed a formal complaint and request for an investigation by an authorized external agency on behalf of Flakes.
- **Dec. 2, 4 p.m. 0:27: LEESVILLE, S.C.** The death of a woman missing out of Barnwell County has been ruled a homicide, according to authorities. The body of Regina Arroyo, 56, was found around 4 p.m. Dec. 3 in the North Fork Edisto River near Wagner Highway in the Leesville area of Lexington County, according to authorities.

Dec. 4, 6 p.m. 2:02: AUGUSTA, Ga. - Weeks after we uncovered complaints detailed in emails between Augusta's fire department and Central EMS, the ambulance service is now responding with its own report card. Central EMS started out in Richmond County as a last-minute midnight call to start service. In a failed Gold Cross deal, commissioners wanted at least eight ambulances.

Dec. 4, 8 p.m. AIKEN, S.C. - It's been about two weeks since we broke the news of the death of a Bamberg County inmate with mental health issues. Alan Thibodeau died in the hospital after he dropped 77 pounds in five months, according to a lawsuit. His family filed a lawsuit against Bamberg County claiming gross negligence led to his death. On Monday, we talked with another family who filed a lawsuit against the same medical company that operates in Bamberg County. Dec. 4, 12 a.m. 1:57: WRENS, Ga. - Money, drugs, and guns are all in a YouTube video News 12 obtained that sparked an investigation, putting more than a dozen people behind bars. Some of the people charged in the investigation are as young as 15 years old and the oldest is 28. Dec. 4, 8 p.m. 1:56: AUGUSTA, Ga. - Some business owners are working around issues like smoke damage after a fire broke out in the 900 block of Jones Street on Monday night. On Monday, the Augusta Fire Department responded to the scene of a structure fire. According to authorities, the fire happened just before 7 p.m.

Dec. 5, 8 a.m. 1:58: JACKSON, S.C. - An Aiken County man is being charged with kidnapping a 30-year-old mother who remains missing a day after his arrest following a raid on a North Augusta home. The Aiken County Sheriff's Office said Wednesday that new arrest warrants had been obtained against Daniel Gabriel Harmon, 34, a day after his arrest on a charge of second-degree domestic violence.

Dec. 6, 7 p.m. 2:02: AUGUSTA, Ga. - A mother of 11 remains behind bars with her oldest son nearly two weeks after a 4-year-old boy died from a gunshot wound. Brittany Ryans and Ladarian Ryans are charged in the death of 4-year-old Zykee Ryans. Through an open records request to the Georgia Department of Family and Children Services, News 12 learned officials with that agency think a 6-year-old was the one who shot Zykee.

Dec. 7, 3 p.m. 1:49: JACKSON, S.C. - A missing Aiken County mom's family is hoping for a miracle. Jamilla Shanae' "Millie" Smith has been missing since Saturday, and her ex-boyfriend, the last person known to have been with her, has been arrested on a charge of kidnapping. Even after authorities have combed the area around Smith's home for at least two days at 425 Old Jackson Highway, there's been no sign of her.

Dec. 7, 6 p.m. 6:03: LOUISVILLE, Ga. - The family of Freddie Walker, who <u>died after a stun-gun incident in July</u>, confirms prominent attorney Benjamin Crump will represent them in the case. Our I-TEAM is digging deeper into the death of Freddie and how deputies handled the situation at the family's home. Walker's family told our I-TEAM they don't feel like the proper protocol was followed.

Dec. 7, 2 p.m. 3:09: THOMSON, Ga. - Family and friends gathered to remember Jonathan Johnson with a balloon release at Thomson Middle School. Jonathan died Nov. 18 at 11:31 a.m. after suffering a gunshot wound to the head in the 500 block of Anderson Avenue. Things are still extremely raw for his family. It's been nearly three weeks since he was shot and later died. Dec. 7, 7 a.m. 2:35: AUGUSTA, Ga. - This week, another pedestrian joined the long list of those claimed by Augusta's busy roads. It's a reflection of a nationwide trend. Amy Marie McMilion,

52, who's homeless, died before dawn Thursday on the eastbound side of the 2000 block of Gordon Highway after being hit by a vehicle.

Dec. 8, 6 p.m. 2:37: JACKSON, S.C. - Saturday marks one week since anyone heard from Jamilla Smith. Deputies say the missing Aiken County mother was running from her boyfriend Daniel Harmon when she went missing. He remains behind bars in the Aiken County Detention Center on domestic violence and kidnapping charges.

Dec. 10, 12 a.m. 2:45: AUGUSTA, Ga. - We're looking into the rules about high-speed police chases after one ended with a Georgia State Patrol vehicle slamming into the entrance sign at News 12. And it all began with a case of speeding. No suspect was ever caught in the late Saturday chase that began on Washington Road and ended about a mile north at 1226 Gray Way.

Dec. 11, 11 a.m. 2:25: JACKSON, S.C. - The family of an Aiken County missing woman is offering a \$5,000 reward for information about her case. Meanwhile, Aiken County Sheriff's Office is following up on every lead to find out what happened to Jamilla "Millie" Smith, who's been missing since Dec. 5. Daniel Harmon was arrested and charged with kidnapping her, but she hasn't been found.

Dec. 11, 8 p.m. 2:57: MILLEN, Ga. - U.S. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg came to Millen on Friday to discuss a new railroad project that Sens. Jon Ossoff and Raphael Warnock announced earlier this week. It'll fix a problem that's plagued the town for decades: trains stopped on the track for an interminable amount of time, blocking traffic on both sides.

Dec. 12, 6 p.m. 2:29: AIKEN, S.C. - Kind and loving words were used by family to describe Jamilla Smith, a missing woman from Aiken County. We are learning more about the moments and days just before her kidnapping. It's been 10 days since Jamilla vanished from her driveway off Old Jackson Highway in Aiken County.

Dec. 13, 6 p.m. 3:22: NORTH AUGUSTA, S.C. - We're learning more about the <u>seven Aiken</u> County massage parlors raided by SLED in August. SLED is not saying what items they took from the businesses, but search warrants show investigators suspected of labor and sex trafficking. During the raid, no one was arrested. But on Friday, SLED did arrest and charge <u>Ping Hong Tang</u>, who is connected to several of the massage parlors.

Dec. 13, 5 p.m. 5:03: AUGUSTA, Ga. - She was fired for lying about a relationship with her supervisor, but a former investigator at the Richmond County Sheriff's Office says she was untruthful because that supervisor ordered her to lie about it. Allison "Allie" Walker says she has the text message to prove it.

Dec. 13, 6 p.m. 1:38: AUGUSTA, Ga. - With Augusta seeing two deadly shootings within 24 hours, it may seem like crime is everywhere, even though at least nationally, the murder rate is down this year. Augusta's latest murder cases claimed the lives of two men.

Dec. 14, 5 p.m. 7:05: AUGUSTA, Ga. - Tyrique Robinson died a week after voters elected him to the Richmond County Board of Education. Authorities ruled his death as a suicide and closed the case one year ago. Now two others are dead — the lead investigator on the case and the mother of Tyrique's son.

Dec. 14, 7 p.m. 2:04: AUGUSTA, Ga. - We've been digging into the surge in pedestrian deaths in Richmond County. We've collected data that shows 60% of those deaths happen in one zip code:

30906. According to numbers from Richmond County Coroner Mark Bowen, 19 pedestrians have died in 2023. Last year, that number was eight.

Dec. 15, 6 p.m. 1:56: AIKEN, S.C. - Last week, News 12 uncovered new details about the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division investigation looking into possible sex trafficking at massage parlors in Aiken County. During the raid in August, no one was arrested. But Dec. 8 in an undercover sting, **SLED did arrest and charge Ping Tang, who is connected to several of the massage parlors**. It's not just happening at certain places. Advocates, like Dominique, say trafficking is everywhere.

Dec. 15, 5 p.m. 3:16: SANDERSVILLE, Ga. - A Washington County chief judge is under investigation by the Judicial Qualifications Commission on 58 counts of judicial misconduct. Ms. Heather Walls" echoes through Grovetown Middle's radio before dismissal. Walls was a cancer survivor, but the cancer came back earlier this year and she died unexpectedly over the weekend.
- Nov. 1, 2 p.m. 1:55: AUGUSTA, Ga. Around this time last year, we talked to Jackson Drumgoole, founder of the Bridge Builder Community. Not only will it be Augusta's first tiny home community, but it's specifically for teens aging out of the foster care system. Many are left with nothing – or very little – when they no longer have a foster home.
