NEWS 6/15/2017

The man who opened fire on members of Congress as they practiced for a charity baseball game was living out of a cargo van and kept mostly to himself. Officials say 66-year-old James T. Hodgkinson of Belleville, IL wounded House Rep. Steve Scalise and others yesterday morning. Capitol police guarding the House majority whip then fatally shot Hodgkinson. Authorities believe Hodgkinson had lived in his van near the scene of the shooting in Alexandria since March.

Survivors of the 2011 mass shooting in Arizona at an event hosted by former U.S. Rep. Gabby Giffords say the recent attack on lawmakers at a congressional baseball practice in Virginia shows how vitriolic political discourse has become. Ron Barber, who took over Giffords' seat in Congress, called for an end to the harsh rhetoric and personal attacks in politics. Other victims said the recent shooting reignited strong feelings about the need for gun control.

The FBI has joined the investigation into the disappearance of a UI visiting scholar from China who hasn't been seen since Friday afternoon. The agency is putting up billboard messages across the state and beyond about 26-year-old Yingying Zhang who arrived on campus in April and was reported missing Saturday. The FBI has labeled the case a kidnapping but investigators haven't ruled anything out.

County law enforcement agencies are training today at St. Thomas Moore High School in Champaign. Don't be alarmed if you see lots of police in the area and people are asked to stay away. Olympian Drive, from Mattis to Duncan will be closed. Police from the state, Champaign, Urbana, Rantoul, UI, area SWAT teams, local fire departments and the sheriff's office are all participating

Although she had said earlier that she would announce by today whether she was running for Congress, State Rep. Carol Ammons was supposed to announce by today whether or not she was running for Congress. And she has made a decision... sort of. She says she's "made a decision actually to not make the decision yet." She'll wait 3-4 more weeks before making a decision.

Ameren Illinois has donated 50 window air conditioners to the East Central Illinois Community Action Agency to help income-qualified families, seniors and people with disabilities keep their homes safe and comfortable this summer.

London's fire commissioner says that firefighters have been traumatized by the devastation they witnessed during a high-rise apartment blaze that killed at least 12 people. Fire Commissioner Dany Cotton says that firefighters are having trouble with the aftermath. She says "we like to think of ourselves as 'rough, tough' and heroes _they are heroes _but they have feelings, and people were absolutely devastated."

A new poll shows a clear majority of Americans think President Donald Trump has tried to interfere with the investigation into Russia's alleged election meddling and possible Trump campaign collusion. Just one in five support his decision to oust James Comey as head of the FBI.

Enterprise announced it will stop doing business in Chicago indefinitely due to theft and vandalism of its vehicles. A spokesman for the rental car company says that about 40% of the company's fleet was hit by theft or vandalism. The company has stopped accepting new reservations and has cancelled current requests for rentals in Chicago.

SPORTS

A couple of Parkland baseball players have been chosen in the MLB draft. Brady Schnauel went in the 20th round to the Phillies, and Jordyn Muffley was picked up by the Rays in the 24th round.

The Mets rallied in the eighth to get past the Cubs 9-4 ... after a rain delay, the Orioles beat the White Sox 10-6 ... and the Cards fell to the Brewers 7-6. *(ALT: The Cubs, Cards and White Sox all lost.)*

Tennis great and equal rights advocate Billie Jean King will speak and receive an honorary degree at Northwestern University's commencement ceremony tomorrow. King's tennis career featured 39 Grand Slam titles, including 20 Wimbledon championships. In 2009 President Barack Obama presented her with the Presidential Medal of Freedom for off-the-court contributions on gender equity and gay rights.

Stephen (STEH'-fehn) Curry and Kevin Durant say they would seriously consider less money to keep the core of the champion Golden State Warriors intact. Curry said all the pieces they have are important to the equation of winning a championship and competing for a title every single year. Durant hinted he would opt out of a deal that pays him the maximum he can get in order to help Golden State's chances of re-signing players such as Andre Iguodala (ihg-ah-DAH'-lah) and Shaun Livingston.

The first pick in this year's NFL draft limped off the field yesterday with a left foot injury. Browns rookie Myles Garrett got hurt while rushing quarterback Brock Osweiler (AHS'-wy-lur) during a drill and stayed on the ground for about a minute. No word yet on the extent of the injury.

Floyd Mayweather Jr. will come out of retirement to meet UFC star Conor McGregor in a boxing match set for August. McGregor has never had a pro boxing fight. Oddsmakers immediately made Mayweather an 11-1 favorite in a fight that will take place in a boxing ring and be governed by boxing rules.
