ISSUE: Brad Loliger - Staff Attorney in the Guardianship Unit at the Center for Elder Law & Justice

Brad Loliger - Staff Attorney in the Guardianship Unit at the Center for Elder Law & Justice, a WNY law firm focused on Alzheimer's and dementia patient Guardianship and legal guidance & support. He described all of the ways his firm is able to provide guidance and legal assistance for these elderly patients who may not be well directed otherwise. Understanding medical law and terms; understanding how income can impact ones ability to be eligible for certain health-care programs, etc. Brad also presented many of the ways and services his firm offers, FOR FREE to these elderly and/or ill patients who need it and how to reach out to his firm. Before leaving, he described a new project they are working on called the 'Ralph Wilson Family Guardianship Project' and how the late Bills owner donated a lot of money towards local programs and projects such as this, to support WNYers in these areas of need.
