### Quarterly Issues / Programs List

**KNAM** provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the previous calendar quarter were:

- **Pandemic:** Fighting the global pandemic is in full swing. Stay at Home and Safer at Home public health orders have been enacted statewide and locally. Our issues programming covers many aspects of how communities are being affected, including interviews with state and local health officials, the chamber of commerce, and other groups concerned about helping people during the unusual impacts from the pandemic.
- **Economy:** The Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce is working with local businesses to help with the impacts. The Glenwood Springs City Council is anticipating massive budget cuts and working to keep the impact at a minimum.
- **Water:** Water is always an issue in western Colorado. This year, headed into the summer, the outlook is for continued dry conditions. The forecast on top of drought conditions already reported around the state.
- **Veterans:** The pandemic is impacting all parts of society, including veterans. VA Secretary Robert Wilke is keeping a close eye on western Colorado to make sure veterans needs are addressed.
