

STATE WEEK IN REVIEW THIRD QUARTER 2015

14-Legislature discusses spending federal pass through to pay for social service programs and discussion of the departure of the Chancellor of the U of I Urbana campus. John O'Connor Associated Press

21- Becky Schlickerman of the Chicago Sun Times. Politics at the Illinois State Fair. Republicans are enthused again now that they hold the Governor's mansion. Senate override of Governor's veto on arbitration & University of Illinois administrative parachutes.

28-Monique Garcia, Chicago Tribune State running out of money because its spending at last year's levels, discussion of whether communities should be allowed to file bankruptcy. State fair attendance discrepancies.

September

4-Guest: Greg Hinz of Crain's Chicago Business. Topics included failure of a democratic override attempt on a highly politicked union bills, the absence of a representative for the vote & Chicago tax hike plan.

11 Guest: Mike Riopell, Daily Herald. Topic was House Speaker Michael Madigan's public rebuke of two Democrats who didn't vote for a controversial labor bill. Lawmaker Ken Dunkin's reaction spells for interesting times when Illinois Democrats need their super majority.

18-Guest: Kurt Erickson Lee Enterprises Springfield Bureau. Judge Rules state must pay in-home senior care, Comptroller decides state payments should be made for assistance to disabled children.
