There were 4 assisted suicide bills introduced into the Michigan legislature just minutes before the session broke. These bills are being referred to as the “Death with Dignity” bills, numbers 678, 679, 680, 681. Genevieve Marnon, Legislative Director of Right to Life, explained that this was an unfair introduction without any available time to respond before the media was informed. There are 10 states that have already made assisted suicide legal. In 2017 there were 7 assisted suicide bills that were introduced but none were ever enacted.

Many think that pain is the driving factor that makes people want to end their life, but it’s actually not wanting to be a burden to others that tempts people to choose suicide. Pastor Jay Gallimore shared that this is illegal in Africa, Asia and the Middle East. It’s Western countries that are abandoning their Christian values. If we are willing to kill our babies, we will have no problem killing our disabled and elderly. You can reach Genevieve Marnon at RTL.org or 517 487-3376. 
In his small town of Baldwin, Michigan in Lake county he mentors youth by giving them jobs in his
