The community issues identified in this report were based on KTSF's ongoing ascertainment process as well as management's knowledge of, and involvement in, the community. Ascertainments may include interviews with community leaders and guests appearing on KTSF produced programs. This Quarterly Issues/Programs List includes public affairs, news, public service; interview programming and community outreach which the licensee feels best represents the station's most significant efforts in responding to community issues.

ASIAN/CHINESE JOURNALS: This regular series of community affairs programs addresses issues facing the local Asian communities. (On a rotating basis throughout the month, the Journals explore issues facing the Vietnamese and Chinese. The Cantonese, Mandarin and Vietnamese Journals are either in language or bilingual (native language and English). The Chinese Journals (Cantonese and Mandarin) air bi-weekly while the Asian Journals (non-Chinese) air on a monthly basis. All KTSF public affairs programs are taped in-studio interviews and are available for viewing on the KTSF website (www.ktsf.com).

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: In addition to programs reflected in this Issues/Programs List, KTSF aired approximately 419 public service announcements in a typical week during this time period. These included foreign-language PSA's produced by KTSF which address issues of public importance.

KTSF NEWS: Our locally-produced live newscasts, in Cantonese and Mandarin, are broadcast seven days a week. An award-winning staff of journalists covers news of local, national and international interest to our Chinese-speaking viewers. Included in this Issues/Program List are examples of KTSF's news coverage. KTSF News currently airs a 2-hours newscast in Cantonese at 7-9pm M-Thursday, a 1-hour newscast in Cantonese at 7pm on Friday, a 1-hour newscast in Mandarin at 10 pm M-F, and 30 minute newscasts on Sat/Sun in Cantonese at 7 pm and Mandarin at 10 pm.

Asian American voters turned out in record numbers for the 2020 election, according to Asian and Pacific Islander American Vote (APIA Vote). According to TargetSmart, in 2016 the Presidential election, a total of 751,778 AAPI voters cast an early ballot in key battleground states. In this year's election, 911,393 AAPI early voters turned out to the polls. AAPI voter turnout in all but three battleground states (PA, VA, WI), exceeded their total from the 2016 election. Victor Lim from San Francisco Department of Emergency Management (DME), now assigned to be liaison with the Chinese Community gave a detailed update of the COVID-19 situation for San Francisco. Data showed San Francisco is continuing with a downward trend so far. San Francisco has over 10,000 cases of COVID, around 100 passed away and around 70 were in ICU and acute beds, if this trend continues San Francisco soon will be allowed by the State to reopen indoor dining (up to 25% of capacity) and also resumed some indoor religions services, Museums, hair saloons etc. may reopen as early as 9/21/2020. But after Labor Day, the positive cases increased and may affect re-opening schedule. Victor also gave update and details about self-isolation and quarantining services that are available: free hotel accommodation, red meals and free supportive services.

Dr. Woo joined the Special Task Force on COVID in April 2020 and tackled a number of important issues to fight COVID. We asked Dr. Woo to give us the latest updates on:

1. Testing: the latest pop-up site and why everyone should take test
2. Tele health: patients are using telehealth to stay in touch with their physicians.
3. Anti-Asian sentiments: on the rise and urge people to report to the police of these action happen to them.
4. SRO situation in Chinatown: more supervision is needed to improve.

Dr. Woo also talked about the importance of Flu Shots and the Flu each year kills 12,000 to 61,000 people in the US. Flu symptoms are very similar to COVID-19, Dr. Woo asked our viewers to take the flu shots earlier and talk to their primary care doctors if they have the symptoms. He also urged viewers to stay positive, get enough sleep and nutrition foods.

Changing COVID health requirement have caused nail salons to open and close multiple times, which makes the situation more challenging. Healthy Nail Collaborative provides updated bi-lingual (Vietnamese and English) health requirements to the nail business owners and employees.

Joe & Emmy Liu Foundation recognizes that 60% Americans have one or more kinds of chronic disease. The nation spent \$4 trillion annually on health care, of which 90% or \$3.5 trillion is for chronic disease care. The chronic disease mortality caused our nation's average lifespan to be below 80, six years behind Japan, Singapore and Hong Kong. These challenges can be overcome based on a recent Harvard School of Public Health's behavior study by tracking 100,000+ candidates for a period of 34 years, started at age of 50, that practice five behavioral habits consisting of no smoking and excess of drinking, regular exercise, diet and weight control over time resulted to a chronic disease-free life with 10+ extra years. The Foundation thus initiated a broader-based chronic disease prevention App called LiuLife SmartLife covering not only Harvard's physical health aspects, but also mental, psychological and medical aspects. It is a leading smart life App to condition holistic behavior habits for disease-free health and extended lifespan.

Dr. Hans Yu discussed the Do's and Don'ts with both COVID-19 and Flu, which have very similar symptoms. Dr. Yu advised everyone to take the Flu shots this year. He also explained why the rate for Asians is so high among those who passed away from being infected with COVID. Back in May, 2020, Asians were over 90% of the fatal cases in San Francisco. But by October, the rate went down to 38%. Dr. Yu believed the Asians in San Francisco tend to be much older and COVID really impacts seniors over 65 years old – as high as 90% of all the cases, the elderly made up 90%+. Dr. Yu stressed some very basic but “Must” for everyone: No gathering, wear mask, keep social distancing and wash hands with soap. When the vaccines are available, hopefully by this year, we should all get vaccinated.

Yat-Pang Au founded Veritas, a housing provider company in 2007. Trained as an Engineer, Pang's career started in the Security business, and then he got involved in buying old buildings in San Francisco and renovated them and then rent them to the tenants. Veritas's portfolio consisted of 90% rent – control units. They owned and renovated over 300 older building in San Francisco and now controls over 6,000 rental units, 80% were under the market rent due to rent control. Pang also provided free apartment to house temporary residents, who are victims of domestic violence, fires, and families of cancer patient through their "Open Door" program. He urged government to provide more social services, market health services to support the growing homelessness population in San Francisco.
