Some pets come from loving families that have no choice but to relinquish their animals to animal control authorities due to home foreclosure. Some rescued pets come from owners who have passed away or due to severe illness can no longer care for their pet. Other animals come from less responsible pet owners who have neglected, abused and/or abandoned their pets.

Upon rescue, many of these animals are in need of medical attention, appropriate food, and socialization with people and other animals. The Foreclosed Upon Pets Inc (FUPI) approach to animal rescue is a proactive alternative to animal cruelty and abandonment. "Impersonation" or "imposter" scams were reported as the most common tactic used to perpetrate scams, according to the Better Business Bureau (BBB). These happen when a scammer pretends to be a trusted company and reaches out to consumers to try to access sensitive information such as social security numbers, bank information, or account details. In 2022, fake order confirmations accounted for more than 50% of Amazon impersonation scams reported by Amazon customers.

The signs of stroke can sometimes be subtle and hard to recognize, so educating yourself and others is key to noticing and responding quickly. A good first step is familiarizing yourself with the acronym BE FAST, which stands for Balance, Eyes, Face, Arm, Speech and Time. The sudden onset of any of these signs could mean that someone is having a stroke, so it's important to BE FAST and call 911 right away when you suspect a stroke.

And 1 in 10 veterans contacted with an offer to assist in enrolling in these benefits say the offer guaranteed a lucrative benefit, which is a telltale sign of a scam and could leave our nation's injured heroes susceptible to fraud. □

Rates of advanced prostate cancer diagnoses have risen 4.5% annually since 2011. While prostate cancer affects men of all races, Black men bear a disproportionate burden of cases and deaths with approximately two to four times as likely to die from prostate cancer than white men.

Dr. David Morris, President of Urology Associates and Dr. Benjamin Garmezy, Assistant Director of Genitourinary Research for the Sarah Cannon Research Institute at Tennessee Oncology, discussed the benefits of having a well-rounded care team for prostate cancer, including a urologist and an oncologist.

Symptoms range in severity from benign to severe and include attention and learning issues, blindness, deafness, chronic pain, deformation, cancers and death. NF affects 1 in every 2,500 births making it more common than Cystic Fibrosis, hereditary Muscular Dystrophy, Huntington's Disease and Tay Sachs combined.
