(v) Establishment of an internship program designed to assist members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment

KSPS PBS Media Makers is a year-round high school internship program in Spokane where high school students--especially those from marginalized populations and under-served communities—work in paid positions alongside KSPS PBS staff in-person at the station. Students are directly introduced to and involved in the various jobs in video production and television stations and learn how to produce purposeful online and broadcast programming including television shows, educational videos, promotional videos, videos for social media, and podcasts.

Interns help create media that furthers the mission of KSPS PBS, "to provide programs and events that entertain, engage and educate to enrich all the communities we serve." In return, they earn high school credit, an hourly wage, and develop real-world materials for their portfolios. Media Makers piloted with two students in the spring of 2023 and hosted its first full cohort of eight students in the fall of 20223. Media Makers developed with funding from Career Connect Washington as a Career Prep program.

KSPS PBS is now developing a rural version of Media Makers where students in rural communities participate in a hybrid remote/in-person program. Teachers participate in externships at the station, students make periodic visits to the KSPS studios, and KSPS Staff visit schools and work with students directly via remote connections. Students create videos about their own communities. The program is set to launch in the spring of 2024, with funding provided by Career Connect Washington.

KSPS PBS brought prolific journalist and reporter Judy Woodruff of the PBS News Hour to Spokane to speak to students at The Community School, who were creating media projects around social issues that spoke to them. At this free school event, students from The Community School asked questions about her work and then presented their projects to her for advice and feedback. Judy was so moved by one student's comment that she requested to connect with that student to offer her further advice on seeking a career in journalism, acting as a mentor.
