#### **FIRST QUARTER 2024**

- 9. <u>Women</u>: Issues impacting women, particularly biases, equal pay, economic security and domestic violence.
- 10. <u>School Reform and Education</u>: Efforts to improve student performance and achievement, making sure teachers are performing well in the classroom and general educational issues in Chicago and the suburbs.
