

WJGV 2nd QUARTER REPORT FOR 2013

The following program list represents broadcast by WJGV which have provided significant treatment toward Putnam county Issues.

***Aired several County Commission Meetings of the quarter when not airing other local Public Affairs or Holiday Specials. The public was allowed form their homes the only broadcast viewing of the Putnam County Commission Meeting. Although the commission meeting does air on a county cable channel(99), it is not during a time convenient for public viewing in our opinion as does WJGV and whereas the cable channel only airs the meeting just 4 times, WJGV airs the meeting several times for viewers during a prime time period for informational needs. During this quarter the public affairs segments was aired on weeknights beginning at 9PM. Normal segments are 2 hours in length.

****Aired all Palatka City Commission Meetings of the Quarter. The City has had several agenda items regarding the Downtown Redevelopment of the 100 Block and River Front. Also aired during PA Segments weeknights at 9PM. Normal segments are 2 hours in length.

1. The City is working on several deals to have a Hotel put on the Waterfront Property of the City to try stimulating downtown traffic.
2. Also, the City is working with a developer regarding the 1894 Building. Some feel it is the last chance to save them. Several Commissioners want them torn down.
3. The City approved the building of an Environmental Museum to be put on the waterfront as part of a deal the State had with Georgia Pacific Paper to put a new pipeline into the river. Some residents did not wish the building to be on the riverfront taking up Park Space.

****Aired Memorial Day Special pre-empting Public Affairs Segment at 9PM on May 27th. The Program was from the past with Sister Dolly Harrell and Bro. Asbury of St. Augustine, who ran away from home and joined the Navy at age 15. Bro. Asbury tells his experience and how he was in several major sea battles of WWII.
