Karl Flagg being a prominent Black Leader in Putnam County and has served in many positions over the last 54 years), Rev. Lloyd Moran, and The Pentecostal Fellowship Center of St. Augustine (Lois Turner), as well as out of contour sermons of The Shiloh Tabernacle (Troy Wiley) and In Search of the Lord's Way (Phil Sanders) on WJGV-CD, 48.1, during the quarter exemplifying the Christian-Judea Ethics and reflexing the need for a return to Christian ethics can be classed as having a significant treatment towards the many ills here in Putnam County, Florida and the surrounding community.
